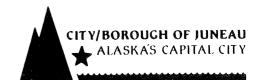

#### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The applicant requests a Conditional Use permit for the development of 5 self-storage buildings with a total building area of 64,800 square feet. Self-storage (ie, storage within completely closed structures) requires a Conditional Use in the D-1 zoning district under CBJ§ 49.25.300, use 10.210.

The proposed project is located, on a 5.78 acre lot accessed via Montana Creek Road. It is located across Montana Creek Road from the active West Glacier Borrow Pit and adjacent to a site with a pending application for gravel extraction. West of the site is the rifle range. Currently the site is used for construction equipment storage and houses a shop building; the shop will remain.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The site was originally part of the West Glacier Borrow Pit which opened in the mid-1950's. In 1961, the Green Construction Company (GCC) established an asphalt plant at the West Glacier pit and extracted materials for general construction fill and as asphalt aggregate. The site was operated by GCC until the mid-1970's, at which time it was leased to various other local contractors until its sale in 1983.

In 2003, Glacier Lands, Inc. subdivided the property onto three lots. This site is one of the lots created by this subdivision.

Numerous self-storage unit projects have been constructed in the City and Borough over the past twenty years, principally at Salmon Creek and Lemon Creek, on Commercial Boulevard and Anka Street, and primarily for boat storage on Industrial Boulevard and Brandy Lane. Much of this type of development in recent years has been permitted as Allowable Uses in the Industrial zoning district, both in the Lemon Creek and Industrial Boulevard areas. The self storage units behind the Jordan Creek Mall are the nearest to this Montana Creek Road site and were approved with a Conditional Use permit.

Much of the City and Borough's accessible and developable industrial land is now occupied. As evidenced by this application, however, the demand for self-storage capacity is continuing, along with the search for suitable sites and zoning classifications. Self-storage (ie, storage within completely closed structures) requires a Conditional Use in the D-1 zoning district under CBJ§ 49.25.300, use 10.210.

#### **ANALYSIS**

**Project Site** - The site has a very level gravel surface and is accessed from Montana Creek Road. The site has been used for many years. Currently there is a shop building on the site, which will remain.

**Project Design -** The applicant proposes 64,800 square feet of self storage (attachment A). The storage will be distributed in 5 single story buildings. The buildings will vary in size, with the

largest being 300'x 60' for 18,000 square feet, and the smallest 300'x 20' for 6,000 square feet. The site plan shows thirty 10'x 20' storage units in Building 1; twenty-eight 20'x 30' storage units in Building 2; thirty 20'x30' storage units in Building 3; twelve 25'x40' storage units in Building 4; and twenty five 16'x30' storage units in Building 5. A vegetated buffer will be maintained along the perimeter of the site. The buildings will be single story, with maximum building height at the peak of the roof being 30 feet. They will have sloping metal roofs and wood or aluminum siding.

CBJ§49.50.300 requires 20% of the site be maintained with vegetative cover. For this site 50,355 square feet of vegetative cover is required. The vegetative cover plan (attachment B) shows 47,555 square feet of vegetative cover. This falls 2,800 square feet short of the 20% requirement. Given the large size of the lot, it seems that the vegetative buffers along the perimeter of the site could be increased slightly to meet the 20% requirement. Staff recommends a condition that in addition to the vegetated areas shown on the site plan submitted with the project application, an additional 2,800 square feet of vegetative cover (at a minimum) shall be provided, and shown on a site plan reviewed and approved by CDD staff prior to issuance of a building permit for any of the proposed structures.

**Traffic -** Using the ITE Trip Generation Manual staff estimated traffic. Using acreage, the highest estimate is 201 trips on a Saturday. When using the gross floor area of the storage units, the estimate is 151 trips on a Saturday. CBJ §49.40.300 states that a traffic impact analysis is NOT required when a development is projected to generate less than 250 average trips in a day.

As part of this Conditional Use permit process, staff solicited comments from the CBJ Streets Department and Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (ADOT&PF) regarding traffic issues and/or concerns related to this proposal. Neither department submitted any comments or concerns regarding the proposed project.

**Parking and Circulation -** CBJ §49.40.210 (a) requires one parking space per 1,000 square feet of gross floor area in a storage building. The project plans show 64,800 square feet of gross floor area, thereby requiring 65 spaces, three of which must be accessible spaces, one of which must be van accessible. Two loading spaces are also required

There is only one driveway accessing this site. A circulation plan is not shown on the site plan. However, the distance between the buildings shown on the plan show sufficient room to allow for parallel parking and 2 way traffic or straight/angle-in parking and one way circulation. Staff recommends that prior to issuance of a building permit for the proposed structures, the applicant must submit a revised site plan showing 62 parking spaces, 3 accessible vehicle spaces, 2 loading zones, and circulation aisles that comply with the requirements of CBJ §49.40.

**Noise** – Noise associated with the development is expected to result from vehicles entering and leaving the site, conversation among facility users, and the movement of stored materials into or out of the facility. Given the proximity of the site to an active gravel extraction operation and the rifle range noise is not expected to be greater than other uses in the area.

**Lighting** – Exterior lighting will be provided to illuminate the driving aisles and parking stalls. Prior to issuance of a building permit, the applicant shall submit a lighting plan illustrating the location and type of exterior lighting proposed for the development. Exterior lighting shall be designed and located to minimize offsite glare. Approval of the plan shall be at the discretion of the Community Development Department, according to the requirements at CBJ §49.40.230(d).

**Public Health or Safety -** The structures meet all zoning requirements for height and setbacks and will meet all applicable building code requirements for fire safety. Fire vehicle access to the property will be via city rights-of-way. The site is located near an active gravel extraction operation and the rifle range. An application for another gravel extraction site has been submitted for the lot adjacent to this one. The adjacent uses make this site undesirable for residential uses. No public health or safety concerns have been raised by this proposal.

**Property Value or Neighborhood Harmony** – Available evidence indicates that property values will not be affected and the proposed use is in harmony with the surrounding neighborhood. As previously mentioned, adjacent uses make this site undesirable for residential development despite the D-1 zoning.

**Conformity With Adopted Plans** - The 2008 Comprehensive Plan speaks to avoiding land use conflicts. Policy 10.4 (pg 145) states:

"It is the policy of the CBJ to minimize conflicts between residential areas and nearby recreational, commercial, or industrial uses that would generate adverse impacts to existing residential areas through appropriate land use locational decisions and regulatory measures."

As mentioned above, because of the existing neighboring land uses this site is not desirable for residential development. Developing it for self storage units will avoid potential land use conflicts that might come if the site was developed for residential uses.

#### **FINDINGS**

CBJ §49.15.330 (e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete;
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses; and,
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ §49.15.330 (f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or,
- 3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ §49.15.330 (e) & (f), Review of Director's & Commission's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

#### 1. Is the application for the requested conditional use permit complete?

**Yes.** We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

#### 2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

**Yes.** The requested permit is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses. The permit is listed at CBJ §49.25.300, Section 10.210 for the D-1 zoning district.

#### 3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

**Yes.** The proposed development complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the July 29, 2011, and August 8, 2011 issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section, and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the subject parcel, visible from the public Right of Way.

#### 4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?

**No.** As established in the preceding staff report, the proposed development will not materially endanger the public health or safety.

# 5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?

**No.** As discussed in the analysis above, the proposed development will not substantially decrease the value of, or be out of harmony with, property in the neighboring area.

6. Will the proposed development be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

**Yes.** As noted above in this staff report, the proposed development is in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, and other officially adopted plans.

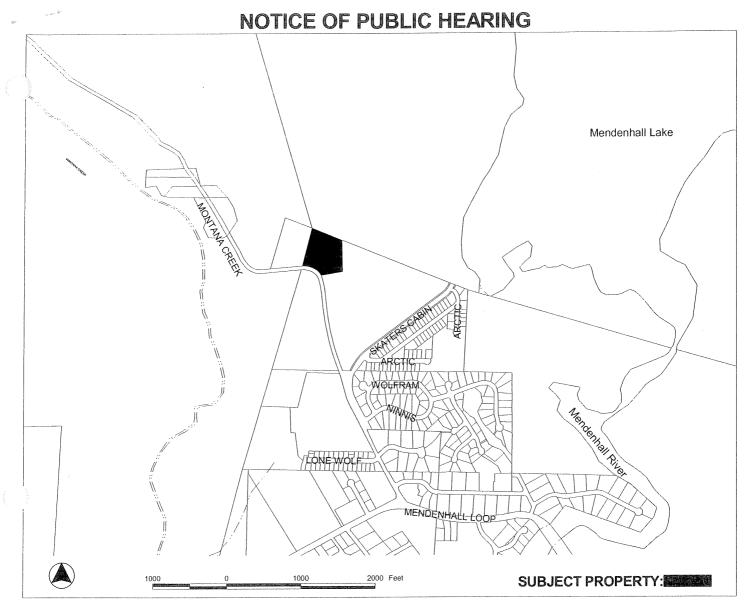
#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and grant the requested Conditional Use permit. The permit would allow the development of five mini-storage buildings totaling 64,800 sq ft. The approval is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. In addition to the vegetated areas shown on the site plan submitted with the project application, an additional 2,800 square feet of vegetative cover (at a minimum) shall be installed or the installation shall be bonded for, and shown on a site plan reviewed and approved by CDD staff prior to issuance of a building permit for the proposed structure.
- 2. Prior to issuance of a building permit for the proposed structure, the applicant must submit a revised site plan showing 65 parking spaces, 3 accessible vehicle spaces, 2 loading zones, and circulation aisless that comply with the requirements of CBJ§49.40.
- 3. Prior to issuance of a building permit, the applicant shall submit a lighting plan illustrating the location and type of exterior lighting proposed for the development. Exterior lighting shall be designed and located to minimize offsite glare. Approval of the plan shall at the discretion of the Community Development Department, according to the requirements at CBJ§49.40.230(d).

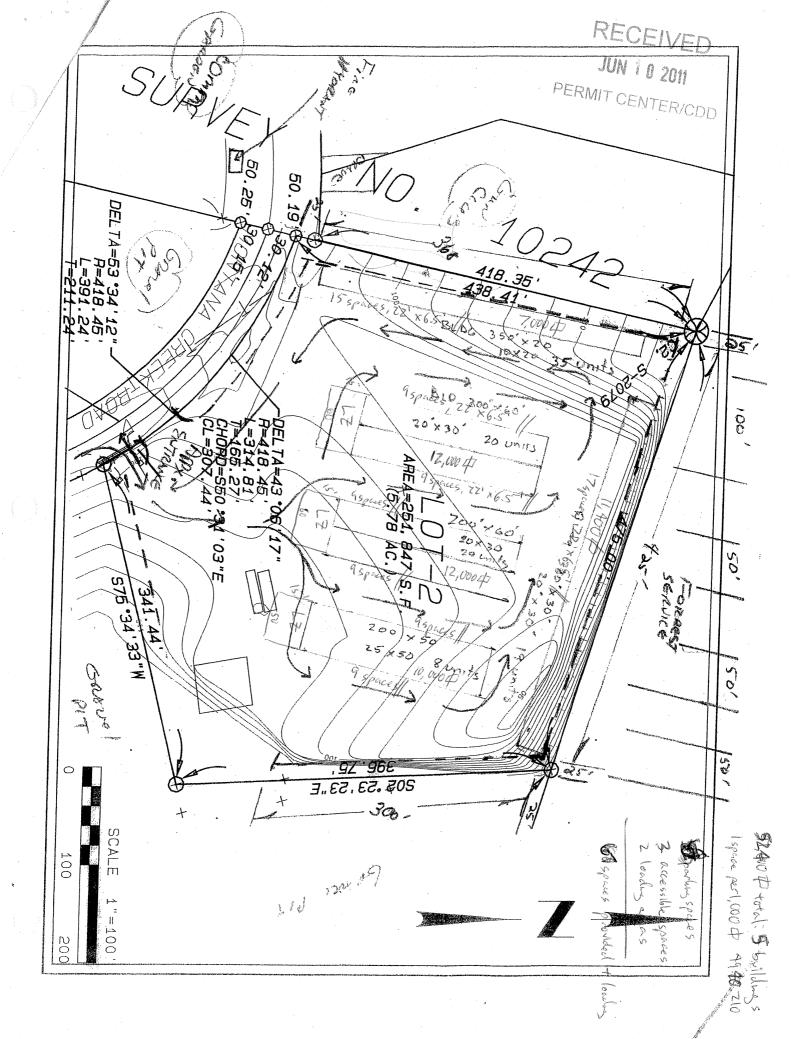
#### 5600 Montana Creek Storage Units

We are proposing to construct enclosed storage units on the 5600 Montana Creek Road property. The property is 5.78 acres and is bordered on the East and Southeast sides by the Montana Creek gravel pit, the Juneau Gun Club range to the West Forest Service land to the North, Montana Creek Road and the proposed Montana Creek West Gravel Pit property to the Southwest. The property in graded and flat with no drainage issues expected. Water is City provided and there is a septic system in place on the property. There is fire hydrant located just across Montana Creek Road from the Southwest corner of the property.

Unit sizes will vary by building and are shown on the attached sketch. Construction will be a basic foundation with a slab on grade. Walls and roof will be constructed to CBJ building standards with a garage door in each individual unit for accessibility. The drive ways will vary from 50 ft to 100 ft wide and will provide ample space for parking, loading, and accessibility to each unit. The units will not be heated but will have lighting. No restroom facilities are proposed. The site will have 24 hour access and managed onsite by Coogan General LLC. There is a locking entrance gate for security and each renter will have a key, or a push code for the main gate and his/her unit door.

To date, the closest storage facility for Valley use is behind the Jordan Creek Mall. No facility exists to serve those in the Back Loop, Mendenhall Valley or Auke Bay areas. Because of the limited numbers of units, 24 hour accessibility, and renters living in a close proximity of the facility, traffic impact will be minimal.

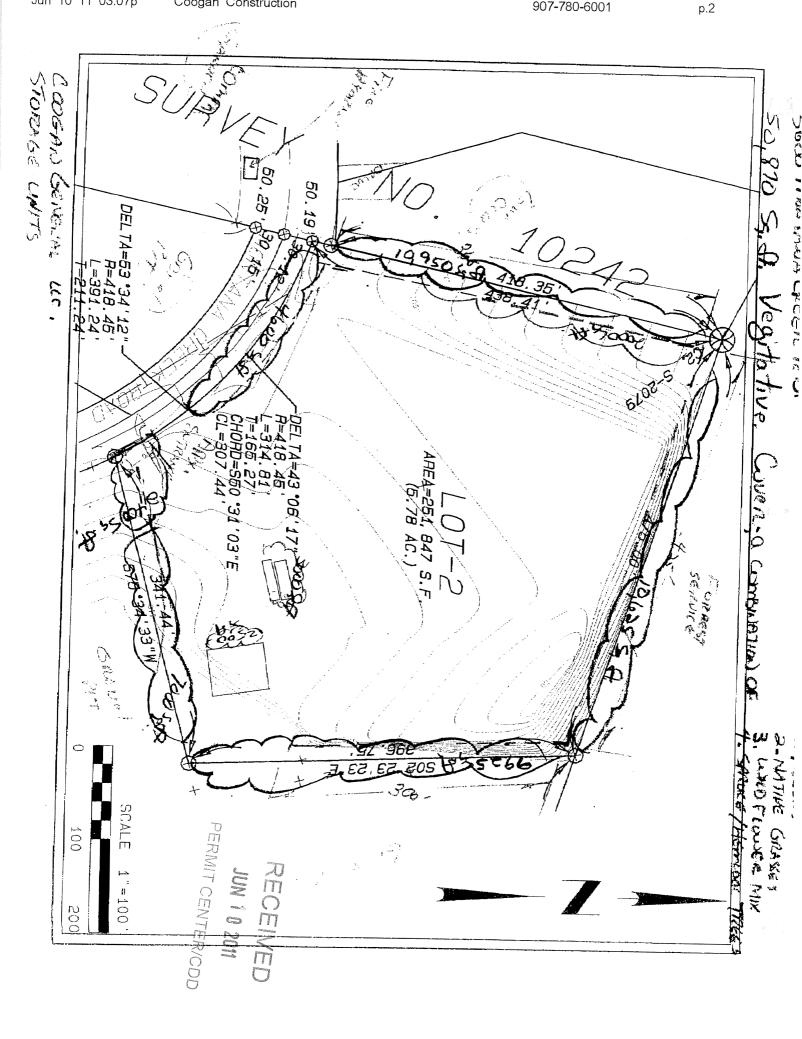

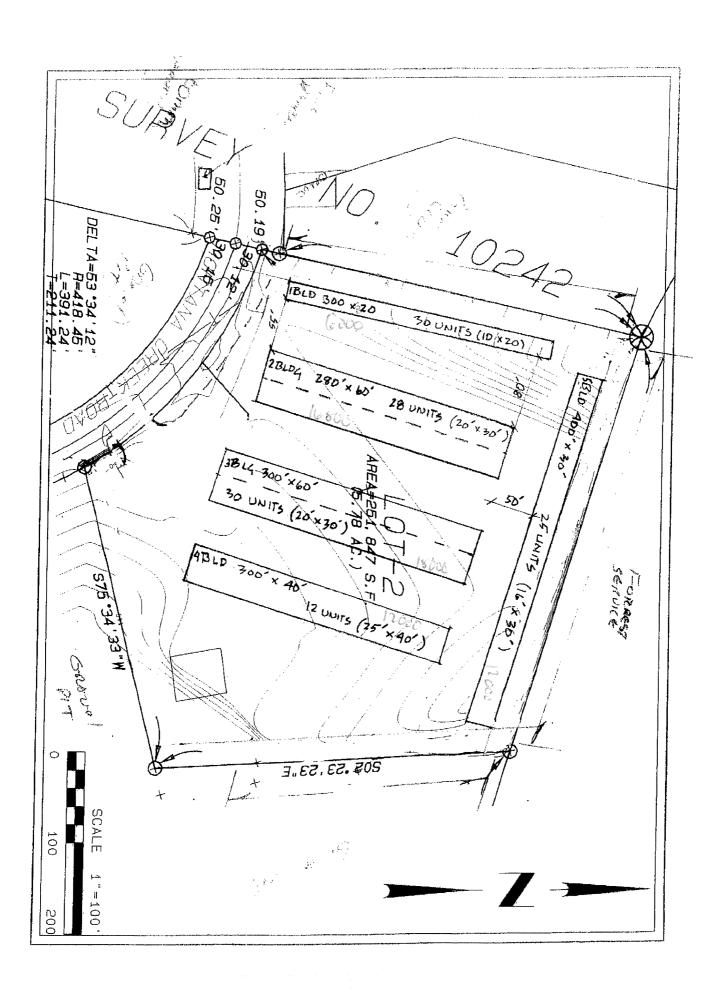
