The Planning Commission, at its regular public meeting, adopted the analysis and findings listed in the attached memorandum dated June 13, 2012, and approved the final plat to be conducted as described in the project description and project drawings submitted with the application and with the following conditions:

- 1. A waiver is granted to waive the requirement for full construction of a roadway within a right-of-way from the north end of the Vista Del Sol Drive cul-de-sac to the neighboring property line to the east, per CBJ §49.35.240(c).
- 2. Note 6 must be removed from the final plat. The final plat will not be recorded until this note is removed from the plat.
- 3. Preliminary plat (SUB2008-00014) conditions No. 3 and No. 4 are no longer required to be met per the EPA letter dated November 1, 2011.

As reference, Preliminary Plat SUB2008-00014 conditions No. 3 and No. 4 are included below. These conditions are no longer required to be met because of a renegotiated settlement agreement with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The EPA's letter is included in the attached memorandum and is dated November 1, 2011.

Preliminary Plat SUB2008-00014 Conditions:

- 3. Prior to final platting, the developer shall identify, with metes and bounds coordinates, the location of the "Drainage/Conservation Easements," per the Wetland Restoration Site Plan. (NO LONGER REQUIRED TO BE MET.)
- 4. The Developer shall include a plat note, as required by the Environmental Protection Agency, identifying the guidelines of the "Conservation Easement". (NO LONGER REQUIRED TO BE MET.)

PROJECT PROPOSAL

The applicant requests final plat approval for Vista Del Sol Phase II, a major subdivision for 24-lots located on Glacier Highway. Two of the ten conditions approved as part of the preliminary plat are no longer required and it is requested that the Planning Commission remove these two conditions. Additionally, it is requested that the Planning Commission grant a waiver so that construction of the roadway from the Vista Del Sol Drive cul-de-sac to the neighboring subdivision not be constructed at this time. This waiver is requested as per CBJ §49.35.240(c). Additionally, the applicant has included a plat note (Note No. 6) requiring that within two years of plat recording, that the area currently dedicated for right-of-way to the neighboring property be vacated if development doesn't occur on the adjacent property. Staff recommends removal of this plat note as it is inconsistent with the Land Use Code. Additionally, staff recommends revised language regarding Plat Note No. 5. These issues will be discussed further below in the staff report.

BACKGROUND

The Vista Del Sol subdivision 25-lot preliminary plat was approved by the Planning Commission on July 8, 2008, with 10 conditions (SUB2008-00014). The final plat substantially conforms to the preliminary plat, with lot sizes and configurations similar to those on the preliminary plat; however, the applicant did file and get approved a minor subdivision creating one lot along Glacier Highway (previous proposed lot 25). That lot now includes a single-family home in fee-simple ownership by its current residents. Because of this, only 24 lots are now included in the final plat because this one lot was platted and sold off in a separate platting action (SMN2011 0019). Regarding the remaining 24 lots that are the subject of this final plat, the only differences in lot sizes are Lots 11, 12, 13, 14, and 24. Lot 11 was reduced from 19,725 sf to 19,715 sf. Lot 12 was reduced from 9,655 sf to 9,647 sf. Lot 13 was reduced from 10,746 sf to 10,744 sf. Lot 14 was increased from 9,653 sf to 9,673 sf, and Lot 24 was reduced from 10,150 sf to 9,132 sf.

ANALYSIS

Zoning- The subdivision is located in a D-5 zoning district. The lot sizes and configurations are consistent with Title 49 requirements for lots in the D-5 zoning district. As noted in the preliminary

plat staff report (SUB2008-00014), several of the lots surrounding the cul-de-sacs do not meet the minimum lot width requirement, but can be allowed under CBJ 49.15.460(4)(a)(i), which states:

"Subdivision lots shall meet the minimum dimensional standard established by chapter 49.25, article IV, provided that in cases of difficult topography or other circumstances rendering compliance impracticable, the director may approve other configurations if the lot:

- a. Meets the minimum lot size requirement;
- b. As drawn, is capable of containing a rectangle having two sides equal in length to the minimum lot width requirement and two sides equal in length to the minimum lot depth requirement;
- c. Has direct and practical access to a street maintained by an agency of government; and
- d. Has at least one practical building location.

<u>Utilities</u>- CBJ sewer and water will serve the 24 lots. The installation of water and sewer are guaranteed by means of a Reconveyance Agreement, conveying a certain number of lots to the CBJ for security until the improvements are installed.

<u>Drainage</u>- CBJ Engineering staff has reviewed and approved the final drainage plans as part of the submitted and accepted final construction plan set. The conditions regarding drainage improvements have been met. Additionally, the drainage improvements are guaranteed by means of a Reconveyance Agreement, conveying a certain number of lots to the CBJ for security until the improvements are installed.

Wetlands- There are no mapped CBJ wetlands on the site; however, the original parcel had approximately 42% of forested wetlands on site, as delineated by the Army Corps of Engineers. Unpermitted activities by the applicant on the site previously led to an enforcement case with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). When the preliminary plat was reviewed in 2008, the EPA recommended conditions be applied to this subdivision to address wetlands restoration onsite. Since that time, a renegotiated settlement with the EPA no longer requires wetland restoration on site. As such, the EPA is no longer requesting Conditions No. 3 and 4. Staff is recommending that these conditions be removed as the wetlands issues have been resolved with the EPA. Please refer to the letter from the EPA, dated November 1, 2011, in Attachment D.

<u>Waiver Request-</u> *CBJ* 49.35.240(c) (5) The commission may waive the full construction of a roadway within a right-of-way that is required to provide access to a bordering property but does not provide any access within the subdivision. The commission can require provision of a roadbed or other appropriate improvements.

The applicant is requesting the waiver of construction of the roadway from the temporary cul-de-sac on Vista Del Sol Drive to the neighboring property per CBJ §49.35.240(c). Staff supports this request as it is the neighboring property owner's obligation to build that portion of the road in the event of development on the adjacent parcel.

Access- CBJ §49.35.210(a) requires that, "The street system shall provide for connecting streets into adjoining unsubdivided lands." Proposed Vista Del Sol subdivision plat shows connection of Vista Del Sol Drive to the adjacent parcel located to the east. That parcel is currently vacant. The applicant requests approval of a plat note (Note No. 6) that would automatically vacate that portion of the right-of-way in the event that development doesn't occur within two years of final plat approval. This plat note is inconsistent with the Land Use Code and staff recommends removal of it prior to final plat recording. Specifically, CBJ §49.15.450 outlines the process for street vacations, which is included below:

49.15.450 - Street vacations.

The following section applies to a subdivision in which any portion of an existing platted right-of-way to be is vacated.

- (1) Submittal and permit process.
 - (A) Petition. No platted street may be vacated except upon petition of the municipality or the owners of the majority of the front footage of the land fronting that part of the street to be vacated. The petition shall be filed with the department accompanied by a copy of the existing plat.
 - (B) Considered. All street vacations shall be considered by the commission after public notice according to section 49.15.230.
 - (C) Simple street vacation. If the request involves a simple street vacation or one which includes the resubdivision of four or fewer lots, the submittal and platting requirements for a minor subdivision shall be met.
 - (D) Complex street vacation. If the request involves a complex street vacation or the resubdivision of more than four lots the application must follow the procedures and platting requirements for approval of a major subdivision.
 - (E) Order of street vacation. After a public hearing before the commission, the applicant shall furnish to the department a proposed order of vacation which shall contain the legal description of the area vacated and other relief requested. The order shall be accompanied by the appropriate plat showing the vacation.

- (F) Title to vacated area.
 - (i) Land lying within a vacated public area shall become part of the lots bordering on the vacated area in proportion, to the front footage thereof except that if the area was originally dedicated by different persons, original boundary lines shall be adhered to. That portion of a vacated street which lies within the limits of a platted addition attaches to the lots of the addition bordering on the street. If a public square is vacated, the title to it vests in the City and Borough. If the property vacated is a lot or tract, title vests in the owner of record.
 - (ii) If the City and Borough originally acquired the vacated area for legal consideration or by express dedication to and acceptance by the City and Borough other than required subdivision platting, then before final vacation the fair market value of the vacated area shall be deposited with the platting authority to be paid over to the City and Borough on final vacation.

A plat note cannot supersede a process outlined in the Land Use Code. While the applicant may petition in the future for this street vacation, a note on the plat cannot automatically vacate the street after a certain period of time. Staff recommends removal of this note as it is inconsistent with the Land Use Code.

It should be noted that this plat note was included on the preliminary plat that was approved in 2008; however, the revised plat that included this note was submitted approximately a week before the public hearing. The staff report that accompanied this version of the final plat does not address this note; in fact, the staff report discusses the requirement of the connection to the adjacent property and the importance of street connectivity. This preliminary plat was on the consent agenda and therefore this discrepancy with this issue was not discussed at the public hearing. Regardless of this, a plat note cannot supercede procedural requirements as codified in the Land Use Code. Staff recommends the removal of this note from the final plat before recording.

FINDINGS

CBJ §49.15.440(3) Commission Action, states that the "Planning Commission shall approve the final plat if the final plat substantially conforms to the approved preliminary plat, and all applicable conditions have been satisfactorily completed." The conditions of the preliminary plat are as follows:

1. The applicant shall include, in the final plat, any additional drainage and utility easements that are required by the CBJ Engineering Department, as a result of changes to the construction plans.

Comment: This has been addressed and this condition has been met.

2. Prior to final platting approval, the applicant shall make all required plat changes, per the comments made by the Community Development Department and the CBJ Engineering Department.

Comment: This has been addressed and this condition has been met.

3. Prior to final platting, the developer shall identify, with metes and bounds coordinates, the location of the "Drainage/Conservation Easements," per the Wetland Restoration Site Plan.

Comment: Has not been met. The EPA and the applicant have reached a renegotiated agreement (Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No. CWA-10-2011-0126) that resolves the unauthorized activities in wetlands associated with this subdivision. The EPA is no longer requiring this condition be met for this project. As such, the applicant is requesting that this condition be removed. Staff concurs with this request as this condition was added at the request of EPA.

4. The Developer shall include a plat note, as required by the Environmental Protection Agency, identifying the guidelines of the "Conservation Easement".

Comment: Has not been met. The EPA and the applicant have reached a renegotiated agreement (Administrative Order on Consent, EPA Docket No. CWA-10-2011-0126) that resolves the unauthorized activities in wetlands associated with this subdivision. The EPA is no longer requiring this condition be met for this project. As such, the applicant is requesting that this condition be removed. Staff concurs with this request as this condition was added at the request of EPA.

5. The developer shall submit a development plan and schedule for re-constructing the streambed and the re-vegetation of the stream bank.

Comment: This condition has been met. The applicant has submitted a plan and schedule for re-constructing the streambed and re-vegetation of the stream bank. Please see Attachment E. The construction plans include the details for reconstruction and revegetation.

6. Prior to final platting, grading and drainage information will be incorporated into the final construction plans.

Comment: This condition has been met. The applicant has submitted final construction plans that include grading and drainage information which CBJ Engineering has approved.

7. The applicant shall construct step pools for that portion of the eastern stream being moved.

Comment: This condition is not yet met; however, the final construction plans incorporate plans for the step pools. Additionally, this improvement is guaranteed by means of the Reconveyance Agreement, conveying a certain number of lots to the CBJ for security until the improvements are installed.

8. The applicant shall construct stream-bank slopes to a maximum of 2 to 1 (2 horizontal to 1 vertical).

Comment: This condition is not yet met; however, the final construction plans incorporate the design and construction of the stream-bank slopes. Additionally, this improvement is guaranteed by means of the Reconveyance Agreement, conveying a certain number of lots to the CBJ for security until the improvements are installed.

9. The applicant shall install an oil/water separator on the storm-drain prior to discharge into adjacent waterways.

Comment: This condition is not yet met; however, the final construction plans incorporate the installation of the oil/water separator as required by this condition. Additionally, this improvement is guaranteed by means of the Reconveyance Agreement, conveying a certain number of lots to the CBJ for security until the improvements are installed.

10. The applicant shall submit a final drainage plan to the CBJ Engineering Department for approval, prior to final platting.

Comment: This condition has been met. The applicant submitted final drainage plans as part of the final construction plans which have been approved by CBJ Engineering.

RECOMMENDATION

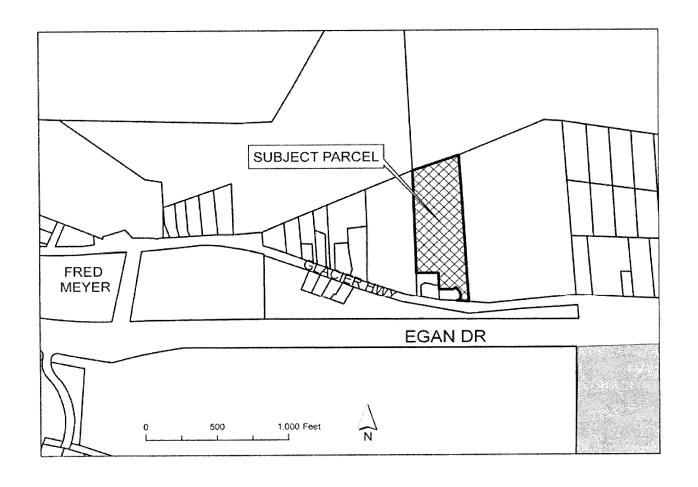
Since the plat is generally consistent with the preliminary plat, and the conditions of approval have been met, staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and approve the requested Final Plat. We further recommend that the approval be subject to the following conditions:

1. A waiver is granted to waive the requirement for full construction of a roadway within a right-of-way from the north end of the Vista Del Sol Drive cul-de-sac to the neighboring property line to the east, per CBJ 49.35.240(c).

- 2. Note 6 must be removed from the final plat. The final plat will not be recorded until this note is removed from the plat.
- 3. Note 5 will be revised to state the following: Vista Del Sol Subdivision Phase I access and utility easement vacated Deed Book XXX, Page XX and dedicated as right-of-way this plat.
- 4. Preliminary plat (SUB2008-00014) conditions No. 3 and No. 4 are no longer required to be met per the EPA letter dated November 1, 2011.

VICINITY MAP

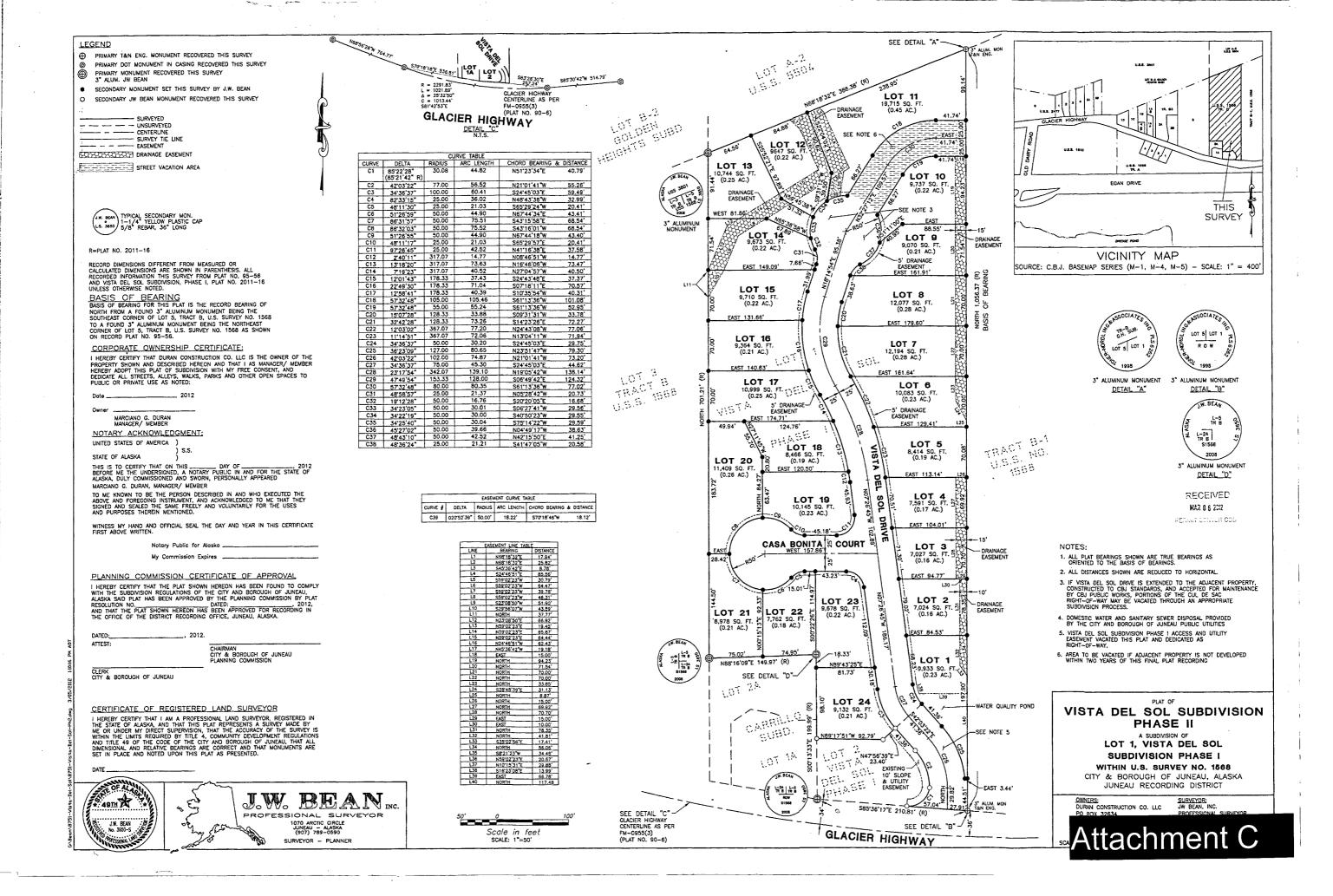

This letter is in regards to your inquiry regarding the Vista del Sol Subdivision in Juneau, Alaska. In April 2005, the Environmental Protection Agency issued to Marciano and Josette Duran, and Duran Construction Company, Inc. (Durans) a Compliance Order (EPA Docket No. CWA-10-2005-0132) associated with the unauthorized discharge of fill material into wetlands for the construction of the Vista del Sol Subdivision. The Compliance Order required the Durans to prepare a Wetlands Fill Removal and Restoration Work Plan (Plan), and to complete wetlands restoration work under the Plan. The EPA approved Plan included requirements to identify a Drainage/Conservation Easement on a subdivision plat map for the Vista del Sol Subdivision, and to include special notes identifying the guidelines of the "Conservation Easement."

EPA has renegotiated the terms of resolving the unauthorized activities in wetlands associated with the Vista del Sol Subdivision. EPA and the Durans have entered into an Administrative Order on Consent (EPA Docket No. CWA-10-2011-0126) which became effective on September 29, 2011. The Administrative Order on Consent requires that no later than six months after the effective date (March 2012), the Durans shall pay \$20,000 to the Southeast Alaska Land Trust for the purpose of off-site wetland compensatory mitigation. This Administrative Order on Consent replaces the Compliance Order (EPA Docket No. CWA-10-2005-0132). Any requirements specified under the Compliance Order are no longer required by the EPA.

Lots 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 20 & 21, Vista del Sol Subdivision Phase II, according to Plat No. ______, Juneau Recording District, First Judicial District, State of Alaska.

as guarantee for construction of road, drainage, and other improvements in Vista del Sol Subdivision Phase II which are conditions to receive final subdivision plat approval pursuant to CBJ 49.15.440, and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions whereby the Grantor must complete the subdivision improvements must be set forth, and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions under which the Grantee shall hold title to the property and the manner by which the above-described property will be reconveyed to the Grantor must be set forth;

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED:

- 1. <u>Conditions to be Performed by Grantor.</u>
 - a. Within two (2) years of the date at which the subdivision plat is filed with

the State Recorder's Office in the Juneau Recording District, or as extended by the commission pursuant to 49.55.010(10), the subdivision improvements shall be completed in conformance with:

- (i) The Grantee's duly adopted subdivision construction standards as set forth in CBJ 49.35, inclusive, and
- (ii) The construction plans and profiles presented by the Grantor along with the final plat for this subdivision pursuant to CBJ 49.15.440, the same having been accepted by the engineer for the Grantee.
- b. The Grantor shall inform the Grantee of the completion of the subdivision improvements within a sufficient period of time prior to the expiration of the performance period subsequent to the filing of the subdivision plat so that the engineer for the Grantee can review the subdivision improvements for conformance with the subdivision construction standards and construction plans. In the event the Grantor receives a written memorandum from the Grantee that the subdivision improvements do not conform, Grantor shall forthwith take whatever action is necessary to comply with the subdivision construction standards and construction plans, and upon completion of the modifications of the improvements, it shall again notify the engineer of the Grantee that the subdivision improvements have been completed and are again ready for inspection.
- c. Upon final acceptance of the subdivision improvements by the Grantee, the Grantor will post a maintenance bond as required by CBJ 49.55.010(7).
- d. The Grantor will pay all real property taxes on the above-described property as if the conveyance to Grantee has not occurred.

e. To reimburse the Grantee for its administrative costs in utilizing reconveyance agreements, Grantor will pay an administrative fee of \$140 for the first lot and \$25 for each additional lot conveyed, substituted or reconveyed to Grantee.

2. Conditions to be Performed by Grantee.

- a. The Grantee will not pledge, encumber, transfer, or otherwise hypothecate the above-described property except in the event of default by Grantor pursuant to 49.55.010(8).
- b. Upon receipt of notice of completion of the subdivision improvements required in order to receive subdivision approval from the Grantor, the engineer or director for the Grantee will review the subdivision improvements and advise the Grantor of his or her acceptance or refusal to accept the subdivision improvements as they exist. If the decision by the engineer or director for the Grantee is not to accept the subdivision improvements, the modifications required to bring the subdivision improvements up to the subdivision construction standards and construction plans shall be transmitted to the Grantor in a written memorandum. After the Grantor notifies the engineer or director for the Grantee that the subdivision improvements have been so modified, the engineer or director for Grantee shall re-inspect the subdivision improvements. The engineer or director for the Grantee shall then notify the Grantor and law department of Grantee, in writing, that the subdivision improvements have been accepted.
- c. Upon Grantor's request, conditional acceptance of a part of the required improvements shall be given after installation and written approval thereof from the Grantee's engineer or director. Partial releases shall be made in installments no smaller than ten percent of the amount originally posted. The value of the released lots shall not exceed the value of the approved improvements, with the values being established by the Grantee's assessing department

and engineer in preparing this agreement. The Grantee shall reconvey to Grantor the released lots by quitclaim deed. The final ten percent or such other amount as may be remaining upon completion of the improvements shall be retained by the department until a maintenance bond is posted in accordance with CBJ 49.55.010(7).

- d. Simultaneous with the Grantor's posting of the maintenance bond required in CBJ 49.55.010(7), the Grantee shall reconvey to Grantor the remaining above-described property by quitclaim deed.
- e. In the event all required subdivision improvements have not been installed in accordance with Grantee's standards and requirements within the performance period, pursuant to 49.55.010(8) the assembly may declare the guarantee forfeited and sell the above-described property and use the proceeds derived therefrom for the purpose of construction of the required subdivision improvements. Proceeds of the sale not used for the construction of the subdivision improvements will be returned to the Grantor after all direct and indirect costs of the sale have been deducted. An accounting of the costs incurred shall accompany the return of the excess proceeds.
- f. Grantee shall not be subject to any covenants, conditions, or restrictions applicable by private agreement to owners of property in Vista del Sol Subdivision Phase II, and Grantor shall indemnify, defend, and hold Grantee harmless against any claim for liability under any such covenants, conditions, or restrictions.
- 3. <u>Severability of Terms.</u> If any term or provision of this agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement, or the application of such terms or provision to

persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be

affected thereby, and each term and provision of this agreement shall be valid and enforced to the

fullest extend permitted by law.

4.

Binding Agreement. The parties to this agreement mutually agree that it shall be

binding upon them and each of their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and

assigns and that this agreement and the deeds mentioned herein contain the final and entire

agreement between the parties hereto and that they shall not be bound by any terms, conditions,

statements, warranties, or representations oral or written, not contained herein.

5. <u>Expiration</u>. Upon reconveyance pursuant to Paragraph 2 of real property

previously conveyed, this agreement shall expire and Grantee shall have no further ownership or

possessory interest in such property.

6. Construction. The parties agree that this instrument shall be construed according

to the laws of the State of Alaska, and that the parties have jointly participated in the negotiations

and drafting of this agreement.

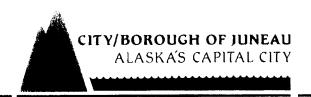

The Planning Commission, at its regular public meeting, adopted the analysis and findings listed in the attached memorandum, dated July 1, 2008, and approved the preliminary plat for a new 25-lot subdivision on USS 1568 Tract B Lot 5 to be conducted as described in the project description and project drawing submitted with the application and with the following conditions:

- 1. The applicant shall include, in the final plat, any additional drainage and utility easements that are required by the CBJ Engineering Department, as a result of changes to the construction plans.
- 2. Prior to final platting approval, the applicant shall make all required plat changes, per the comments made by the Community Development Department. and the CBJ Engineering Department.
- 3. Prior to final platting, the developer shall identify, with metes and bounds coordinates, the location of the "Drainage/Conservation Easements," per the Wetland Restoration Site Plan.
- 4. The Developer shall include a plat note, as required by the Environmental Protection Agency, identifying the guidelines of the "Conservation Easement."
- 5. The developer shall submit a development plan and schedule for re-constructing the streambed and the re-vegetation of the stream bank.
- 6. Prior to final platting, grading and drainage information will be incorporated into the final construction plans.
- 7. The applicant shall construct step pools for that portion of the eastern stream being moved.
- 8. The applicant shall construct stream-bank slopes to a maximum of 2 to 1 (2 horizontal to 1 vertical).
- 9. The applicant shall install an oil/water separator on the storm-water drain prior to discharge into adjacent waterways.
