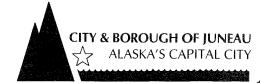

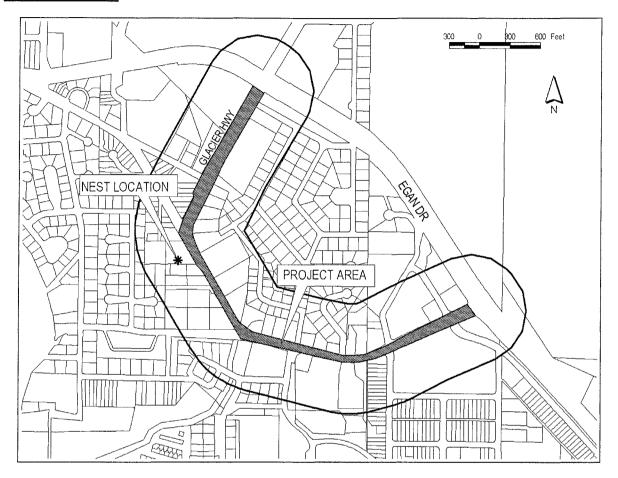

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant is proposing to rehabilitate Glacier Highway between the intersection of Egan/Glacier Highway (McDonalds) and Mendenhall Loop Road/Glacier highway (near the Skate Park), see vicinity map. The project description identifies two eagle's nests within the project area: nest # 115 and nest #126 (See Attachment A); however, nest #126 near the Mendenhall Loop Road/Glacier

Highway intersection is no longer there. US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) confirmed that nest #126 is no longer there by air and then a site visit in mid June 2012 (See e-mail from USFWS Attachment B).

This variance request would allow DOT&PF to rehabilitate a section of Glacier Highway within the 330 foot buffer of an eagle nest (See Attachment C). The proposed development requires a Variance because construction, occurring on public land, would be within 330 feet of an eagle nest. The CBJ Land Use Code states the following:

49.70.310 Habitat (emphasis added)

- (a) Development in the following areas is prohibited:
- (2) Within 330 feet of an eagle nest on public land;
- (3) Within 50 feet of an eagle nest on private land, provided that there shall be no construction within 330 feet of such nest between March 1 and August 31 if it contains actively nesting eagles;

BACKGROUND

CBJ has traditionally relied on the expertise of the local office of the USFWS to evaluate and condition, if necessary, projects within the 330 foot eagle nest buffer. In September 2009, USFWS issued a new federal rule establishing eagle permits. There are two different types of eagle permits. One permit allows for the take of eagles where the taking is associated with but not the purpose of the activity; most takes authorized under this type of permit are in the form of disturbance. The other type of permit is for the removal of an inactive eagle nest where it is necessary for public health and safety; for example, if there is a nest constructed in a human-engineered structure, or if the removal of a nest would provide a net benefit to eagles.

USFWS eagle permits are voluntary, not mandatory. However issuance of an eagle permit provides the applicant with a guarantee against federal prosecution under the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act if the project results in disturbance or take. It's up to the applicant to determine whether the risk of disturbance from the project is worth the time and cost of obtaining the federal permit.

CBJ has always relied on local USFWS expertise to evaluate variances to the eagle tree setback. If an applicant has obtained an eagle permit from USFWS through the new federal permit process, we will defer to the USFWS recommendation. CBJ will not, however, repeat federal permit conditions on CBJ authorizations. If the applicant has not obtained a USFWS permit, since the permit is voluntary, CBJ will seek as much information as possible from USFWS about the sensitivity of the particular nest and what modifications may be needed to ensure protection.

In this particular case, the USFWS advised DOT&PF that the pair of eagles that uses nest # 115 are, in fact, habituated. The location of the nest is close in proximity to the airport and higher traffic volumes and noise from Glacier Highway and Egan Drive. The USFWS recommended DOT&PF

not apply for an eagle permit for the work proposed in this rehabilitation project (See Attachment D).

ANALYSIS

Staff solicited comments from Community Development Building Department, General Engineering, Fire Department, CBJ Assessor's Division, CBJ Lands and Resources, CBJ Streets Department, and CBJ Parks and Recreation.

Comments were received from General Engineering, CBJ Streets Department, and the Fire Department. None of the comments received had any concern with the variance request.

Variance Requirements

Under CBJ §49.20.250 where hardship and practical difficulties result from an extraordinary situation or unique physical feature affecting only a specific parcel of property or structures lawfully existing thereon and render it difficult to carry out the provisions of Title 49, the Board of Adjustment may grant a Variance in harmony with the general purpose and intent of Title 49. A Variance may vary any requirement or regulation of Title 49 concerning dimensional and other design standards, but not those concerning the use of land or structures, housing density, lot coverage, or those establishing construction standards. A Variance may be granted after the prescribed hearing and after the Board of Adjustment has determined:

1. That the relaxation applied for or a lesser relaxation specified by the Board of Adjustment would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners.

The relaxation applied for would give substantial relief to the property owner by allowing maintenance of Glacier Highway. A lesser relaxation is not practical because the maintenance must take place within 330 feet of an existing eagle nests, and failing to maintain the roadway would result in a public safety hazard. The Variances would be consistent with justice to other property owners along the highway by allowing required maintenance to provide safe access to their property.

Yes. Staff finds that criterion 1 is met.

2. That relief can be granted in such a fashion that the intent of this title will be observed and the public safety and welfare be preserved.

The intent of Title 49 is established in Section 49.05.100 Purpose and Intent. Those sections, which are applicable to the requested variance, are as follows:

1) To achieve the goals and objectives and implement the policies of the Juneau Comprehensive Plan and the coastal management program;

- 2) To ensure that future growth and development in the city and borough is in accord with the values of its residents;
- 3) To identify and secure, for present and future residences, the beneficial impacts of growth while minimizing the negative impacts;
- 4) To ensure that future growth is of the appropriate type, design, and location, and is served by a proper range of public services and facilities such as water, sewage, and electrical distribution systems, transportation, schools, parks and other public requirements, and in general to promote public health, safety and general welfare;
- 5) To provide adequate open space for light and air; and
- 6) To recognize the economic value of land and encourage its proper and beneficial use.

A grant of the variance would allow rehabilitation of Glacier Highway within 330 feet of an eagle nest. Additionally, USFWS has issued a letter stating that an eagle permit is not necessary because "the project poses low risk to nesting eagles" (See letter from USFWS Attachment D). The Variance is therefore in accordance with intent numbers 2, 3, 4, and 6.

Yes. Staff finds that criterion 2 is met.

3. That the authorization of the Variance will not injure nearby property.

Construction within the eagle tree setback would not injure nearby property. All work would be within the right-of-way.

Yes. Staff finds that criterion 3 is met.

4. That the Variance does not authorize uses not allowed in the district involved.

Road construction is allowed in all zoning districts; therefore, the Variance does not authorize uses not allowed in the district involved.

Yes. Staff finds that criterion 4 is met.

5. That compliance with the existing standards would:

(A) Unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permissible principal use;

Compliance with the standard would unreasonably prevent the owner, DOT&PF, from maintaining this portion of Glacier Highway. However highway maintenance is not technically considered a permissible principal use in any zoning district.

No. Staff finds that sub-criterion 5A is not met.

(B) Unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property in a manner which is consistent as to scale, amenities, appearance or features, with existing development in the neighborhood of the subject property;

Compliance with the standard would unreasonably prevent the owner, DOT&PF, from maintaining this portion of Glacier Highway. Allowing the highway to fall into disrepair would create a public safety hazard and be detrimental to the amenities, appearance, and features of existing development in the neighborhood of the subject property. Comparing the Glacier Highway right-of-way to other residential properties in the neighborhood adjacent to the right-of-way is not a relevant comparison.

Yes. Staff finds that sub-criterion 5B is met.

(C) Be unnecessarily burdensome because unique physical features of the property render compliance with the standards unreasonably expensive;

There are no unique physical features along Glacier Highway. The roadway is mostly flat with only the occasional gradual hill and curves in the road.

No. Staff finds that sub-criterion 5C is not met.

or

(D) Because of preexisting nonconforming conditions on the subject parcel the grant of the Variance would not result in a net decrease in overall compliance with the Land Use Code, CBJ Title 49, or the building code, CBJ Title 19, or both.

There are no pre-existing non-conforming conditions within the Glacier Highway right-of-way.

N/A. Staff finds that sub-criterion 5D is not applicable.

Yes. Staff finds that criterion 5 is met because sub-criterion 5B is met.

6. That a grant of the Variance would result in more benefits than detriments to the neighborhood.

A grant of the Variance would allow this stretch of Glacier Highway from the Egan/Glacier Highway intersection to the Mendenhall Loop Road/Glacier Highway intersection to be maintained according to current road safety standards, which would provide a significant benefit to the neighborhood. The USFWS is not concerned that the proposed rehabilitation would impact the eagles at this location. Therefore the Variance would result in more benefits than detriments to the neighborhood.

Yes. Staff finds that criterion 6 is met.

FINDINGS

1. Is the application for the requested Variance complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

Per CBJ §49.70.900 (b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

2. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Programs?

N/A. This variance request complies with the Juneau Coastal Management Program.

3. Does the variance as requested, meet the criteria of Section 49.20.250, Grounds for Variances?

Yes. Based on the analysis above, staff finds that the proposal does meet the criteria of CBJ 49.0.250, Grounds for Variances. Specifically, the Variance meets criteria 1, 2, 3, 4, 5B, and 6.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board of Adjustment adopt the Director's analysis and findings and approve the requested Variance, VAR2012 0013. The Variance permit would allow for the rehabilitation of Glacier Highway within 330 feet of an eagle nest.

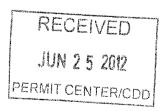
Project Location and Description

Project Location

The proposed project is located on Glacier Highway and is approximately 5,100 feet in length. The beginning of the project (BOP) is at the intersection of Egan Drive and Glacier Highway. The project follows the loop to the end of the project at the Mendenhall Loop Road/Glacier Highway intersection (EOP). This segment is located in Sections 30 and 31, T40S, R66E, Copper River Meridian, on the Juneau B-2 USGS Quadrangle Map.

Project Description

Glacier Highway has experienced significant wear and is near the end of its useful life. The proposed project would rehabilitate the road with a new layer of asphalt concrete pavement. Additional improvements would include in-kind repairs to curb cuts and curb ramps to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards where needed. All work would occur within the existing right-of-way.

Dear Mr. Schelb,

This responds to your request for assistance in determining if the above referenced project will have adverse impacts on eagle nests in the project area. After review of the Mendenhall Loop Road Repaving and Curb Repair documents we find there will be no adverse impacts from the project to nesting eagles and do not recommend applying for an eagle disturbance permit.

Description of the Proposed Actions

The Department of Transportation proposes to repave and conduct curb repair work from the intersection of Egan Drive (across from McDonalds), continuing around Mendenhall Loop Road and terminating at Egan Drive.

Bald Eagles

According to our Eagle Nest Database, there is one eagle nest in the project area (see Fig 1). Although the project is within the 330' buffer recommended by the National Bald Eagle Management Guidelines, the eagle pair has demonstrated tolerance to human activity. Tolerance has been demonstrated by the pair building a nest within 100' of Mendenhall Loop Road, the proximity of the nest to a small business, and continuous noise from the airport. We do not recommend applying for an eagle disturbance permit because the project poses low risk to nesting eagles.

Please contact this office if any previously unknown eagle nests are discovered within 330° of the project areas for documentation in the Alaska Bald Eagle Nest Database or for further guidance on eagle disturbance permits.

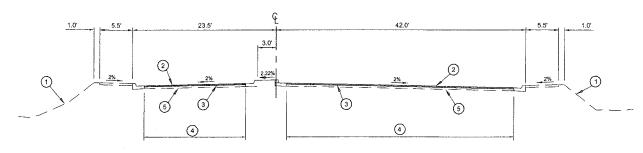
