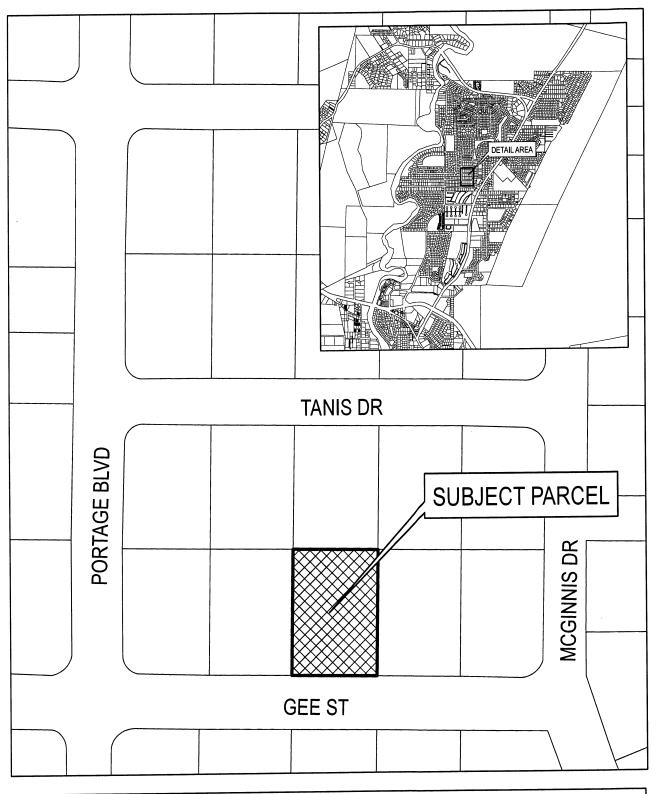

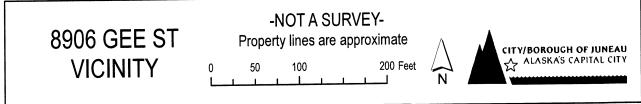

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant requests a Conditional Use permit for the expansion of an existing child care home. Currently the child care at this site serves 8 children and the applicant is requesting a Conditional Use permit to expand from 8 children to 12.

BACKGROUND

This property is zoned D5 with a minimum lot area of 7,000 square feet. This lot exceeds the minimum lot size with a lot size of 13,405 square feet. The property owners of this lot own and operate Jack and Jill's Play Care. Jack and Jill's Play Care opened in 2009 when the applicant requested a building permit for a child care home with up to 8 children in their home at 8906 Gee Street BLD2009-00440 (See Vicinity Map). The applicant has been operating a licensed child care home at this location since that time. They are now requesting to expand their business as a result of increased demand for their services; they are requesting to increase from 8 children to 12. The hours of operation will not be expanding from what is currently offered. Currently, Jack and Jill's Play Care is open Monday – Friday from 7:15 am – 4:15 pm.

The home is setup as a child care home with eating, and napping, and playing areas (both inside and out). Interior or exterior modifications will be necessary. A portion of the back yard is fenced for an outdoor play area (See photos—Attachment A). A significant portion of this lot has been paved; therefore, the applicants are proposing to park their vehicle(s) toward the rear of the property to ensure that there will be sufficient drop-off and pick-up spaces for the clients (See Parking Plan—Attachment B). Based on the parking plan submitted, three vehicles can fit across and two deep for a total of 6 cars for drop-off/pick-ups. There is additional space to stack cars along side the house. Parking in the right-of-way was a concern raised by the CBJ Streets Department and the CBJ General Engineering Department during the inter-departmental review of the application. Their concerns have been alleviated with the revised site plan showing all parking on the applicant's property and that no parking in the Gee Street right-of-way.

ANALYSIS

Staff solicited comments from Community Development Building Division, CBJ Streets, CBJ General Engineering, CBJ Assessor's Office, Fire Department, CBJ Lands and Resources, CBJ

Parks and Recreation, and CBJ Public Works.

Comments Received:

Charlie Ford, Building Codes Official, CBJ Building Division The Building Department has no issues with this project.

Dave Crabtree, Utilities Superintendent, CBJ Public Works, Water Utility Division *This home should be required to get a water meter installed.*

Brent Fischer, CBJ Parks and Recreation Director *Parks and Recreation has no concerns*.

Sven Pearson, Deputy Fire Marshall, Fire Department

The previous building permit inspections were good, so there is no reason to believe that there will be any issues with the expansion of the child care home from 8 to 12 children. (Paraphrased from e-mail conversation)

Ron King, Chief Regulatory Surveyor, CBJ General Engineering My concerns are the use of the right of way for parking and grading/drainage of the parking area. 7/26/2012

Discussions occurred between staff and the applicant and all parking was moved on-site; no parking is proposed along the chain link fence adjacent to Gee Street.

Follow-up statement from Ron King

As long as the spaces are on private property it doesn't matter. Be sure the site/parking plan shows that. 7/31/2012

I agree with Ron's concern. They have very limited parking available and it does appear they are using the right-of-way between their fence and the street for parking. Adding another 4 children is definitely going to increase traffic and need for parking, if only to drop off and pick up. I can see it being especially problematic in the winter when that right-of-way area is full of snow and cars are stopping on the street to drop off kids. 7/27/2012

Project Site – The project site is 0.30 acre lot with frontage on Gee Street. The site is currently used as a single family residence and a licensed child care home for up to eight children. The site looks similar in style to other residential properties in the neighborhood (See photos—Attachment B).

Project Design – The applicant uses their single family dwelling as follows: three bedrooms for napping, three multi-purpose rooms for play, living room for older children napping (if needed), and kitchen/dining room for meals. A portion of the back yard is fenced in with a play set and other large toys. The applicant states that a small portion of the paved back yard is used for tricycle riding and can be gated if needed. The applicant states that expanding the child care for four additional children will not result in any modifications to the site.

Comments received from Dave Crabtree, CBJ Public Works identify that this project will require a water meter at the site; therefore, staff recommends the following advisory condition:

• A building permit is required for the increase of a child care home from 8 to 12 children. Prior to Building Final, the applicant shall install a water meter in accordance with CBJ §75.01.050(b)1(A).

Traffic – There will be approximately three times during the day where increased traffic would occur as a result of drop-offs/pick-ups. The times are as follows: 7:15 am – 8 am, 11:45 am – 12:45 pm, 3:00 pm, and 4 pm – 4:15 pm. Because there are multiple times where parents are dropping off or picking up their children traffic congestion is unlikely. Mid-day traffic is a result of children who attend preschool and are only in day care partial days. Below is a chart showing the number of children that are dropped off or picked up during each time slot based on the current mix of children attending Jack & Jill's Play Care:

This results in a total of 14 trips to 8906 Gee Street which is just slightly more than the average daily trips of a single family residence. Because this use generates an average of 14 trips (or 28 round trips) to the site; a Traffic Impact Analysis is not required.

Additionally, both adjacent property owners have stated that the current operation has not resulted in a traffic concern and are in support of this Conditional Use permit request knowing that additional traffic would result if this Conditional Use permit is approved (See Public Comment—Attachment C).

Parking and Circulation – In the applicant's application materials there are photos and a site plan showing parking along the front yard adjacent to the chain link fence (See Applicant Submittals—

Attachment D). After reviewing this parking layout that location was determined to be within the Gee Street right-of-way. Discussions occurred between staff and the applicant and the applicant submitted a revised parking plan on August 3, 2012 showing parking occurring on-site (See Parking Plan—Attachment B).

Title 49 Chapter 40 Access, Parking, and Traffic regulates parking spaces for land uses. However, there is no determined parking requirement for child care homes. When child care homes are reviewed for conformance with Title 49, staff has reviewed and approved parking and parking layout based on expected demand and feasibility. Based on the project description presented by the applicant and testimony of neighboring property owners, it appears that the parking provided on-site will be adequate for the proposed child care home expansion. There are at minimum 6 spaces available for pick-ups/drop-offs and currently there are no more than 5 pick-ups/drop-offs in any given timeframe (See table under Traffic heading).

Noise – Noise intensity is not expected to be any more than what currently occurs with the existing permitted child care home.

Public Health or Safety – The review completed by the Fire Department, CBJ Building Division, CBJ Streets Division, and CBJ General Engineering had no concerns regarding public health or safety. Additionally, the Fire Department conducted an inspection of the site during the review of the initial child care home permit in 2009, that permit has been finaled with no remaining condition holds. Increasing the communities licensed child care provides a benefit to the health and safety of the community.

Habitat - The location of Jack & Jill's Play Care is established; there are no plans to expand the footprint of the structure or do any significant work to the overall site. Additionally, there are no mapped wetlands, eagle's nests, anadromous fish streams, or flood zones on this parcel; therefore, there are no habitat concerns with this proposal.

Property Value or Neighborhood Harmony – As discussed above, in comments from the CBJ Assessor's Division, this project does not present concerns that would result in a decrease in property value. Furthermore, the public comment submitted to date adjacent property owners to the east and west are in full support of the existing business operation and the planned expansion (See Public Comment—Attachment C).

Conformity with Adopted Plans - The 2008 Comprehensive Plan identifies eight guiding principles. One is particularly relevant to this project (pg 2); "A safe place to raise a family".

Providing safe, quality, licensed childcare for school aged children is part of making Juneau a safe place to raise a family. Furthermore, access to safe, licensed childcare allows parents to enter, or remain in the work force. One of the identified goals of the CBJ Assembly for 2010-2011 is "Promote greater availability and affordability of day care for young working parents."

FINDINGS

CBJ §49.15.330 (e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete;
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses; and.
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ §49.15.330 (f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or,
- 3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ §49.15.330 (e) & (f), Review of Director's & Commission's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

1. Is the application for the requested conditional use permit complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

Yes. The requested permit is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses. The permit is listed at CBJ §49.25.300, Section 1.520 for the D5 zoning district.

3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

Yes. The proposed development complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the August 3, 2012 and August 13, 2012 issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section, and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the

subject parcel, visible from the public Right-of-Way.

- 4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?
- **No.** As discussed above, the project will enhance the public health and safety by expanding a licensed child care facility.
- 5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?
- **No.** Based on the above analysis the use will maintain value and will be in harmony with the neighboring area.
- 6. Will the proposed development be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

Yes. As discussed above, the proposed development is in general conformity with the land use plan.

Per CBJ §49.70.900 (b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

7. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Program?

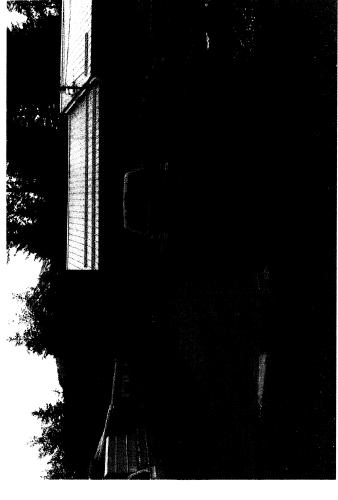

RECOMMENDATION

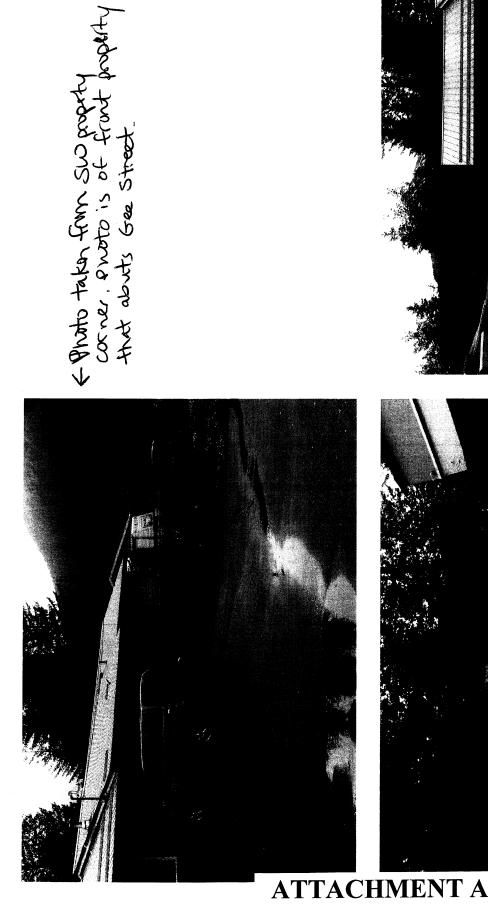

Allowable/Conditional Use Permit Application Instructions

<u>Pre-Application Conference</u>: A pre-application conference is required prior to submitting an application. The applicant will meet with City & Borough of Juneau and Agency staff to discuss the proposed development, the permit procedure and to determine the application fees. To schedule a pre-application conference, please contact the Permit Center at 586-0770 or via e-mail at <u>Permits@ci.juneau.ak.us</u>.

<u>Application</u>: An application for an Allowable/Conditional Use Permit will not be accepted by the Community Development Department until it is determined to be complete. The items needed for a complete application are:

Forms: A completed Allowable/Conditional Use Permit Application and Development Permit Application form. The "land owner or lessee consent" signature <u>and</u> initials are <u>mandatory</u> on the Development Permit Application form.

Fees: The fee is dependent upon the class of the proposed use. Land Use fees generally range from \$300 to \$1,350. Any development, work or use done without a permit issued will be subject to double fees. All fees are subject to change.

Project Description: A detailed letter or narrative describing the project.

Plans: All plans are to be drawn to scale and clearly show the items listed below:

- A. Site plan, floor plan and elevation views of existing and proposed structures
- B. Existing and proposed parking areas, including dimensions of the spaces, aisle width and driveway entrances
- C. Proposed traffic circulation within the site including access/egress points and traffic control devices
- D. Existing and proposed lighting (including cut sheets for each type of lighting)
- E. Existing and proposed vegetation with location, area, height and type of plantings
- F. Existing physical features of the site (i.e. drainage, eagle trees, hazard areas, salmon streams, wetlands, etc.)

Document Format: All information that is submitted as part of an application shall be submitted in either of the following formats:

- A. Electronic copies may be submitted by CD, DVD or E-mail in the following formats: .doc, .txt, .xls, .bmp, .pdf, .jpg, .gif .xlm, .rtf or other formats pre-approved by the Community Development Department.
- B. Paper copies may not be larger than 11" X 17" (Unless a larger paper size is preapproved by the Community Development Department).

<u>Application Review & Hearing Procedure</u>: Once the application is determined to be complete, the Community Development Department will initiate the review and scheduling of the application. This process includes:

Review: As part of the review process the Community Development Department will evaluate the application for consistency with all applicable City & Borough of Juneau codes and adopted plans. Depending on unique characteristics of the permit request the application may be required to be reviewed by other municipal boards and committees. During this review period, the Community Development Department also sends all applications out for a 15-day agency review period. Review comments may require the applicant to provide additional information, clarification, or submit modifications/alterations for the proposed project.

Hearing: All Allowable/Conditional Use Permit Applications must be reviewed by the Planning Commission. Once an application has been deemed complete and has been reviewed by all applicable parties the Community Development Department will schedule the requested permit for the next appropriate meeting.

<u>Public Notice Responsibilities</u>: As part of the Allowable/Conditional Use permitting process, all permit requests must be given proper public notice, which consists of the following:

Community Development Department: Will give notice of the pending Planning Commission meeting and its agenda in the local newspaper a minimum of 10-days prior to the meeting. Furthermore, the department will mail abutters notices to all property owners within 500-feet of the project site.

Applicant: Will post a sign on the site at least 14-days prior to the meeting. The sign shall be visible from a public right-of-way or where determined to be appropriate by the Department. Signs may be produced by the Community Development Department for a preparation fee of \$50, and a \$100 deposit that will be refunded in full if the sign is returned by 4:30 p.m. on the Monday following the scheduled hearing date. If the sign is returned later than the Monday after the Planning Commission meeting, but within two weeks of the meeting, \$50.00 may be refunded. The applicant may make and erect their own sign. Please speak with the Community Development Department for more information.

My name is Jill Anderson, owner and administrator of Jack and Jill's Play Care. We are located at 8906 Gee Street. Days and hours of operation are Monday-Friday 7:15am to 4:15pm. I am licensed to care for 8 children. I am interested in raising my capacity from 8 to 12 children. My husband Lloyd who retired last year will be the second childcare provider to help out with the increase. With such a shortage of childcare in our town, we feel that it is important to try and offer wonderful care for the families that were already providing for. Some of these families are having their second and third child and would really like to do all possible to keep the siblings together.

Our home is already set up for childcare and I do not plan on making any changes to the inside of our house. We offer 3 large rooms for children to play inside. There are 3 bathrooms available for use. We have a large kitchen area to accommodate 12 children for meals. Three of our bedrooms are used for napping Infant/toddlers if needed. Our living room is used for the older children's nap area.

Outside we have a large driveway for parking. There is also more available parking in front of our yard. We own two cars one that leaves for work/school at 730am, the other one stays in our driveway. Our driveway is equipped to hold 4 vehicles plus ours parked up along the side, for a total of 5. In the front of our yard we are able to accommodate three more cars for parking. Please see photos attached. In the morning there will be 5 vehicles dropping off children between the times of 715am-8am. Two of these families have multiple children in childcare. At 11:45am there will be 2 more vehicles arriving to drop off preschool children from school. Between 12:15 and 12:45pm two children will be picked up from part time morning care. As you can see there are different times throughout the day of vehicles coming and going. For evening pick up, there will be 3 schoolteachers that pick up their children at 3:45pm. 5 children will be leaving at this time. The last 5 children are picked up between 4-415pm., again 2 families with multiple children. I don't foresee any problems at all for parking.

We bought our home in 1992. We know most of neighbors well and there has never been any problem with us operating our childcare. A couple of homes on the block are rental homes and we do not know these families that well yet.

Our front and back yards are both very large and completely fenced in with a claim link fence. Both yards are used for the kids play area. Our back yard is set up with a giant play set and a jungle gym. We also have an area set aside from the back with a

that is paved for riding tricycles. The noise level throughout the yards is always monitored, and we have never had any complaints from our neighbors.

Our home has five doors/emergency exits leading to the outside. We are equipped with fire alarms in every room, with multiple fire extinguishers and carbon monoxide detectors placed throughout the house. Jack and Jill's has been inspected and approved by the fire marshal.

I am interested in setting up an appointment for a pre application conference and to apply for a conditional use permit. I look forward to hearing from you.

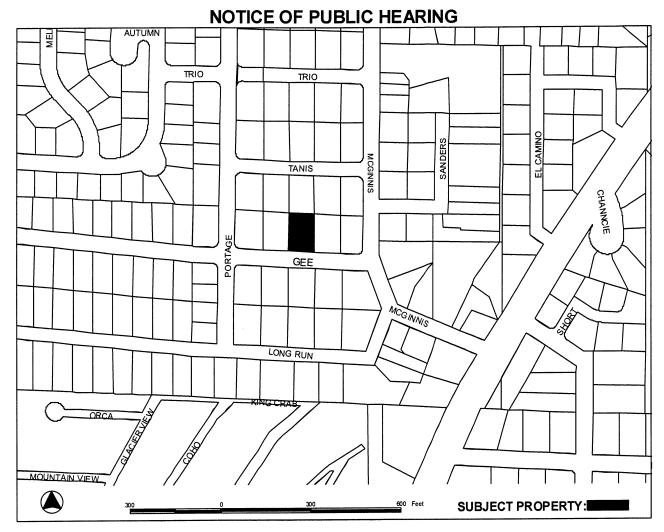
