PROJECT DESCRIPTION

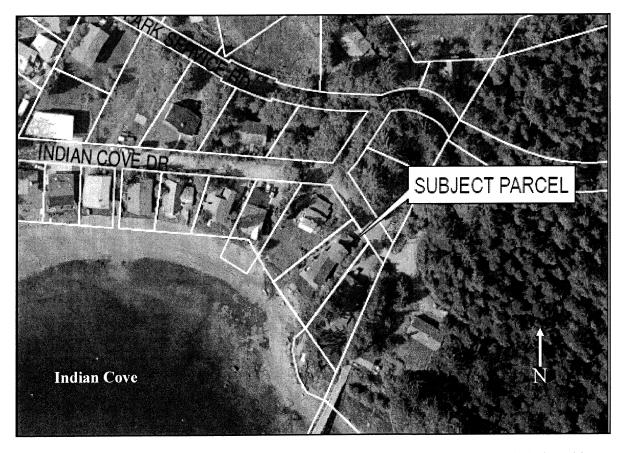


Figure 1. The proposed accessory apartment would be located on the parcel labeled 'Subject Parcel' along Indian Cove Drive. Property lines are shown in white.

The applicant requests a Conditional Use permit to construct an Accessory Apartment attached to an existing house along Indian Cove Drive. Vicinity map is provided under Attachment A. According to section CBJ §49.25.510 (d)(2)(G) of the Land Use Code, an approved Conditional Use permit is required for an accessory apartment if the site is either substandard lot size or has an on-site private sewer system. Both of these elements exist and have resulted in the filing of the subject permit. Figure 1 below shows an aerial image of the neighborhood and subject property.

BACKGROUND

The neighborhood was platted in 1962 under a past zoning district with the subject property having 9,969 square feet of area. Today, this property is located in a D-3 district which requires a minimum of 13,000 square feet. Therefore, the property's lot size has become substandard.

City sewer currently ends approximately 2 miles away and does not reach the subject neighborhood. All residences in the neighborhood, including the subject property, utilize on-site waste water treatment systems or marine out falls to manage effluent. The City does not have any near-future plans to extend sewer to this neighborhood.

According to section CBJ §49.25.510(d)(2) of the Land Use Code, Accessory Apartments are restricted to one bedroom or efficiency up to 600 square feet of net floor area. These restrictions limit the intensity and use of the apartment and allow their inclusion in neighborhoods without causing adverse impacts to existing residences.

ANALYSIS

Project Site

The property is located along Indian Cove, just west of the Alaska State Ferry Terminal, as seen in Figure 1. A single-family dwelling with an attached 2-car carport exists on the site. Access to the site is along Indian Cove Road from Otter Way, which connects to Glacier Highway. Figure 1 shows an aerial image of the property.

The neighborhood is developed primarily with single-family dwellings. As stated earlier, the neighborhood was platted in 1962 under a different zoning district. Many properties along the waterfront are of similar size or smaller than the subject parcel, as depicted in Figure 1.

Project Design

The accessory apartment will be created by adding an apartment to the second floor area. This entire floor will be dedicated to the apartment, while the ground and lower floor areas will be used as the main dwelling with three bedrooms and two-and-half bathrooms. Floor plans of the house are provided under Attachment C.

Access to the apartment is provided from an interior staircase near the common entry on the ground floor. The apartment is designed at 589 square feet in size with a single bedroom, one bathroom, and living, dining and cooking areas, as shown in Attachment C. The proposal meets the accessory apartment size and bedroom limits of CBJ §49.25.510(d)(2).

Traffic

As seen in the vicinity map, the neighborhood along Indian Cove Road and National Park Road is relatively small and results in low traffic volume. As stated earlier, the neighborhood is primarily developed with single-family dwellings. Due to the Land Use Code restrictions of accessory apartments, traffic volume increase will be minimal to none.

The CBJ Streets and Fleet Divisions indicated they had no objections to the proposal.

Parking and Circulation

The existing single-family dwelling was built with a two-car carport. The carport will be converted into a garage, subsequent to the apartment addition, and will continue to accommodate two vehicles. The garage is shown on Attachment C.

The accessory apartment requires one parking space. As shown in Attachment C, there is adequate space in front of the garage to meet the parking requirement of the apartment.

Noise

As stated earlier, the neighborhood is small and primarily developed with single-family dwellings that result in low noise levels. Allowing a new single-bedroom dwelling unit within an existing residence will not increase existing noise levels in the neighborhood.

Public Health or Safety

The addition of a single-bedroom apartment attached to an existing dwelling will not result in increased risk to the public health or safety. The City Fire Marshal, Dan Jager, did not have any issues with the proposal.

Attachment D provides a letter indicating that the existing on-site sewer treatment system has been approved by the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) for a four bedroom house. Overall, there will be a total of four bedrooms with the accessory apartment. Therefore, the on-site sewer treatment system will be adequate.

Habitat

Developing the accessory apartment will not impact any habitat regulated by the Land Use Code.

Property Value or Neighborhood Harmony

The addition of a single-bedroom apartment attached to an existing dwelling will cause little to no increase in the existing traffic volume or noise levels, nor exceed the capacity of the treatment system, or cause other deleterious impacts to the neighborhood that could negatively affect property value or neighborhood harmony.

Having the proposed apartment designed within the existing single-family dwelling will help the addition blend with neighboring residences.

Staff determines that the property value and neighborhood harmony will be preserved with the approval of the accessory apartment.

Conformity with Adopted Plans

According to the 2008 Comprehensive Plan of the City & Borough of Juneau, the property is located in a Rural / Low Density Residential (RLDR) Land Use category. This category is defined as residential land consisting of 1-3 units per acre based on having city utilities such as water and sewer. As stated earlier, the property contains a single family dwelling. Adding an accessory apartment onto the dwelling which can both be served by the existing on-site waste water treatment service will be consistent with the RLDR Land Use category.

Further, the 2008 Comprehensive Plan indicates a need for more affordable housing. The policies below are germane to the proposal.

- POLICY 4.1. It is the policy of the CBJ to facilitate the provision and maintenance of safe, sanitary, and affordable housing for its residents.
- POLICY 4.2. It is the policy of the CBJ to facilitate the provision of an adequate supply of various housing types and sizes to accommodate present and future housing needs for all economic groups.

The proposed accessory apartment will provide additional housing options. This could have a ripple effect that frees up other housing stock which could open more affordable housing opportunities. Therefore, the proposal is consistent with the above 2008 Comprehensive Plan policies.

The proposal meets the yard setbacks, parking requirement, and size and bedroom restrictions of the Land Use Code.

Overall, the proposal meets and is consistent with adopted plans and applicable Land Use Codes.

FINDINGS

CBJ §49.15.330 (e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete;
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses; and,
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its

reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ §49.15.330 (f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or,
- 3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ §49.15.330 (e) & (f), Review of Director's & Commission's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

1. Is the application for the requested Accessory Apartment permit complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

Yes. The requested permit is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses. The permit is listed at CBJ §49.25.300, Section 1.130 for the D-3 zoning district.

3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

Yes. The proposed development complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the October 12, 2012 and October 22, 2012 issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section; and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the subject parcel, visible from the public Right of Way.

4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?

No. As indicated earlier, the City Streets and Fleets Division and Fire Department did not express any concerns with the proposal. Further, the existing on-site waste water treatment system is adequate to meet the needs of the proposed accessory apartment.

5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?

No. As stated above, with the restricted size and one bedroom allowed in an accessory apartment, staff finds that there will be little to no increase in noise and traffic levels. Further, with the proposed apartment being designed within the existing dwelling, the building will not look intrusive.

6. Will the proposed development be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

Yes. As indicated earlier, the proposal meets all yard setbacks, parking requirement, and size and bedroom restrictions of the Land Use Code. Further, adding more housing options may create and free up other existing housing that could result in more affordable residences. This is consistent with the 2008 Comprehensive Plan policies. The resulting density of the property and safe sanitary system will allow the proposal to be consistent with the land use category of the Plan as well.

Per CBJ §49.70.900 (b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

7. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Program?

Not Applicable. There are no elements of the development that are germane to Juneau Coastal Management Program review.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and grant the requested 589 square foot Accessory Apartment permit.

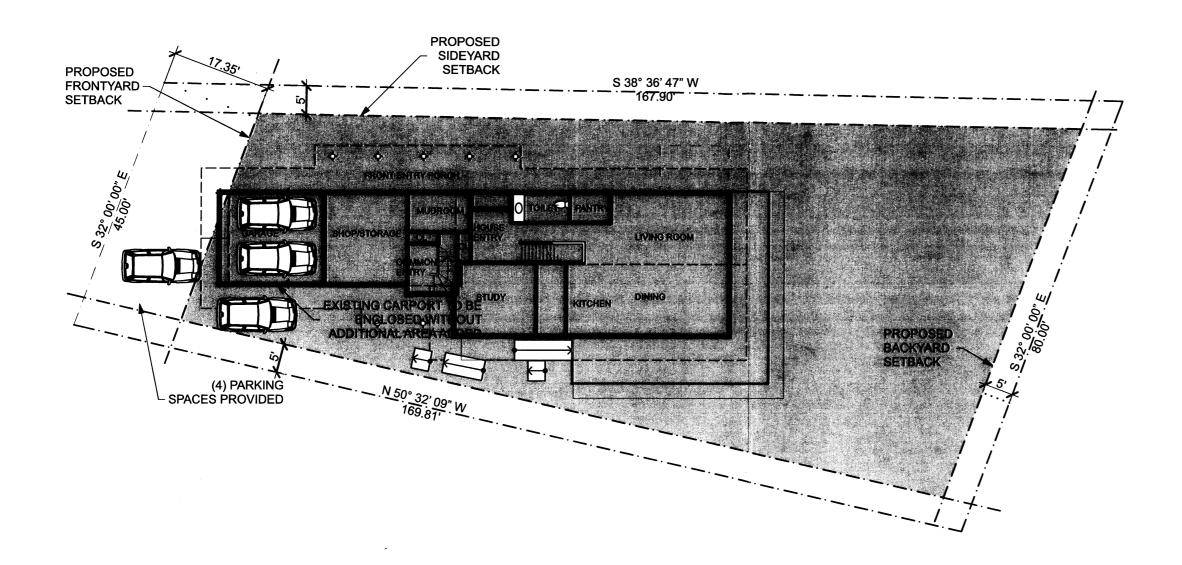
Background

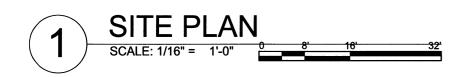
The lot supports an existing single-family dwelling with accessory apartment which was recently acquired by the owner. This accessory apartment has been in existence in the neighborhood a minimum of ten years. In the pursuit of a building permit and subsequent discussion with CBJ Community Development staff, the current dwelling was found to be non-compliant in the allowance of an accessory apartment, unbeknownst to the current owners. At the time of purchase as the current owners understood the property to be in compliance as an understanding of the contract.

The proposed accessory apartment is desired as an expected fiscal asset to the current owners financial obligations. Understanding the legal requirement to bring the current property into compliance to support their planned renovation, the owner proposes meeting the CBJ code requirements as condition of their proposed renovation work. The apartment is proposed to be brought into compliance and approved. A specific improvement as a result of this renovation effort will be to reduce the existing size of the accessory apartment from approximately 1,102 sf. to 598 sf.

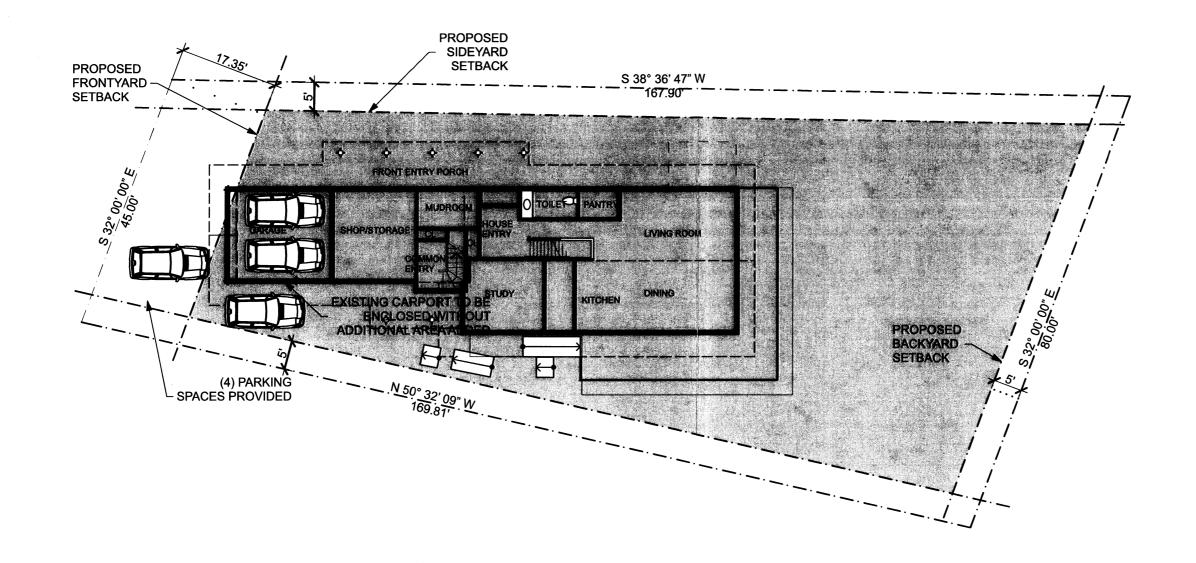




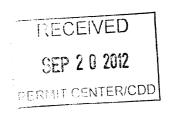




SITE / ROOF PLAN / SURVEY & DETAILS A03

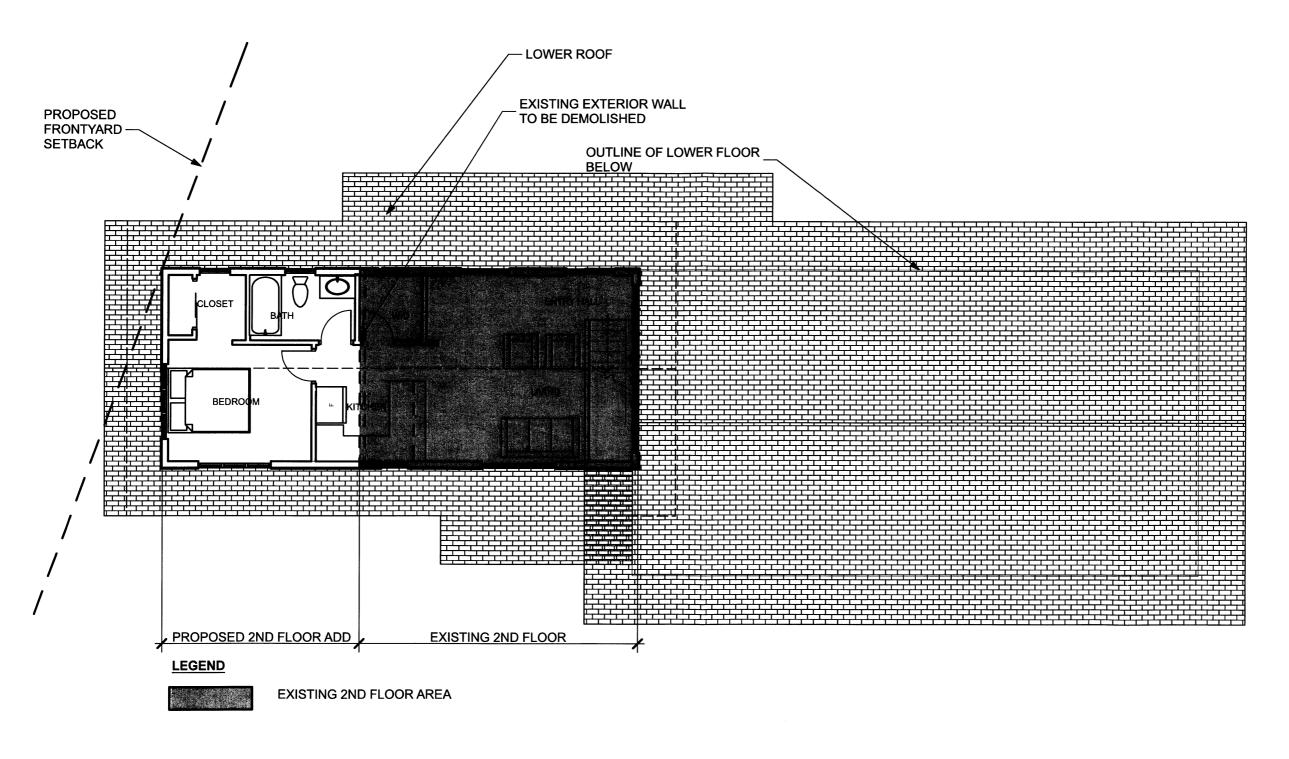








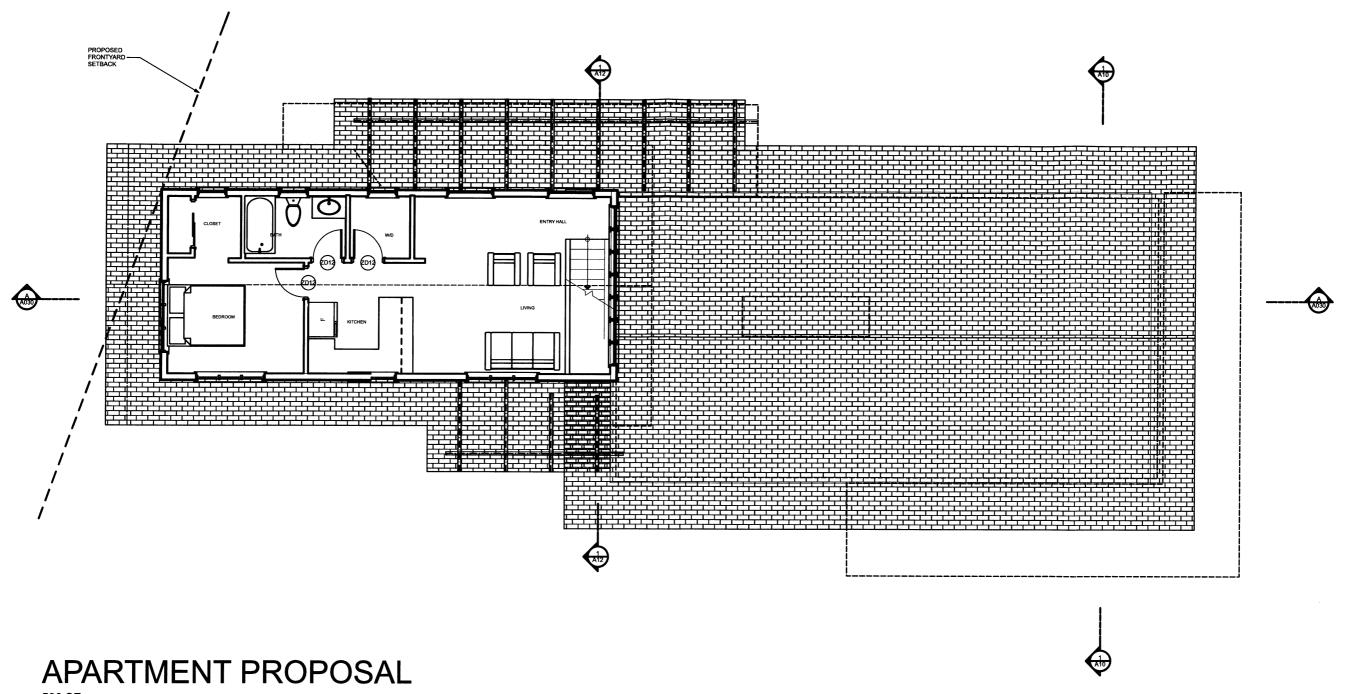
PROPOSED SITE PLAN

SECOND FLOOR - LOWER ROOF PLAN

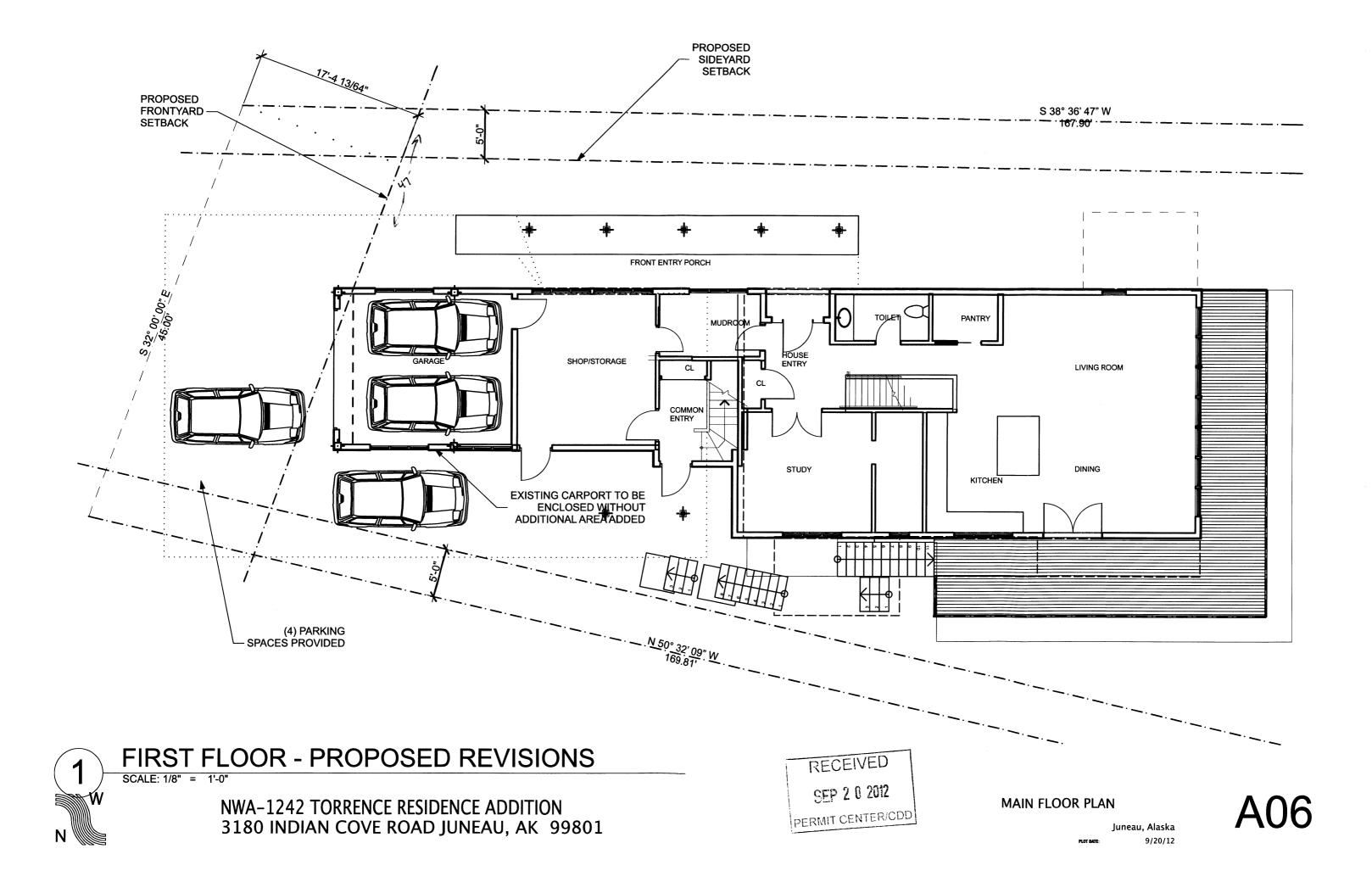

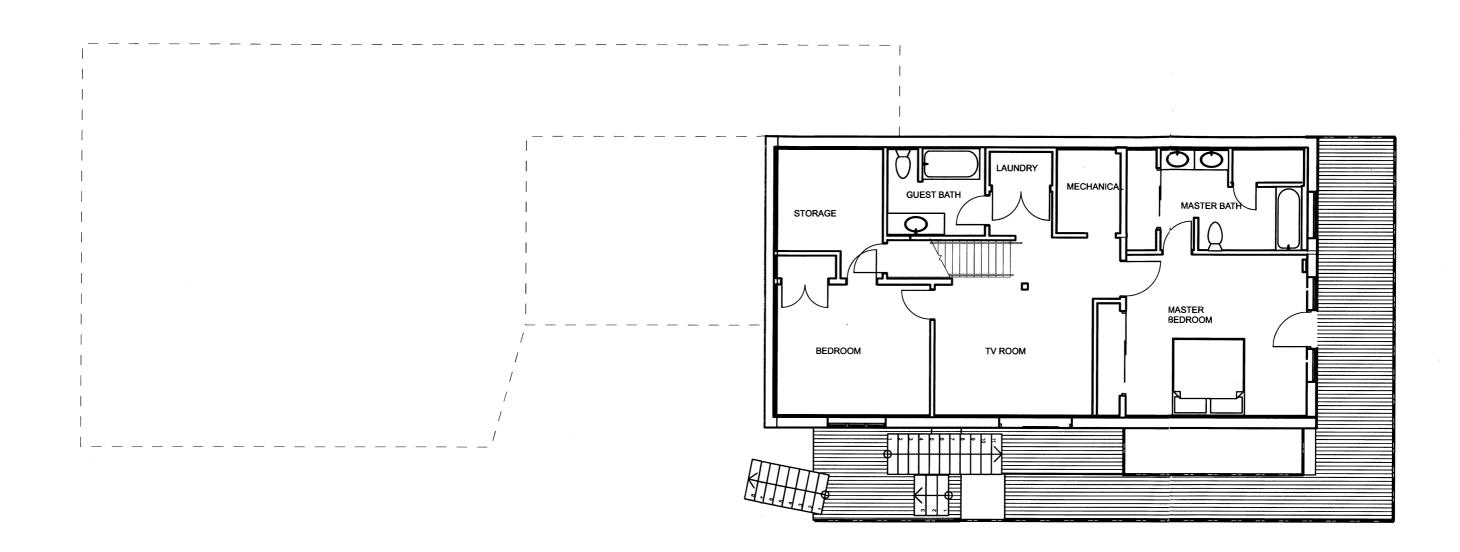




UPPER FLOOR PLAN

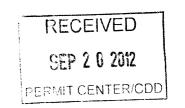








NWA-1242 TORRENCE RESIDENCE ADDITION 3180 INDIAN COVE ROAD JUNEAU, AK 99801
