PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant requests a Conditional Use permit to expand the second story within a required side yard setback of the existing building containing Seong's Sushi Restaurant and CJ Enterprises in downtown Juneau.

According to the Land Use Code section shown below, a property owner may add a second story atop of a building that was permitted within a required yard setback:

CBJ § 49.25.430(4)(M) Additional stories.

The commission, through the conditional use permit process, may allow the addition of a second or third story atop or below an existing enclosed structure which projects into a required yard setback if the structure is either lawfully nonconforming or if a variance was previously granted for the structure. The commission may deny such request if it finds that the structure, with the addition, would result in excessive blockage of views, excessive restriction of light and air, or other deleterious impacts.

BACKGROUND

The neighborhood was platted and developed prior to zoning standards. Many properties do not conform to current standards. The subject building was constructed in 1951 prior to zoning regulations, and lies very close to many property lines. Under current zoning standards, the building encroaches into nearly all yard setbacks. This creates building challenges and limitations for expansions to meet the yard setbacks.

The property was recently purchased by the applicant and, as of the date of this memorandum, is currently renovating the entire building through Building permit no. BLD2012 522. The following uses exist in the building:

1st Floor – Seong's Sushi Restaurant and CJ Enterprises (retail);

2nd Floor – One, 3-bedroom apartment.

Proposed changes under BLD2012 522:

 1^{st} Floor – Expand Seong's Sushi Restaurant, Reduce and halve CJ Enterprise retail space 2^{nd} Floor – Expand second floor into 4 apartments (2, 2-bedroom and 2, 1-bedroom)

Except for the second-story addition in the side yard setback, all of the above proposed changes only require a Building permit.



Figure 1. Picture of subject building. Glacier Avenue is to the left and West Ninth Street is to the right side of the picture. Seong's Sushi Restaurant is shown on the ground floor.

As seen in Figure 1 above, the parking area is located along Glacier Highway and results in back-out parking onto Glacier Avenue. Back-out parking is unsafe and not allowed in the Land Use Code, but has occurred at this location before current parking standards. Along with the building renovation, all of the parking spaces will be relocated to the side alleyway. New planter boxes and benches will be constructed in place of the parking spaces. These can be seen in Figure 2 on the following page.

ANALYSIS

Project Site

As stated under Background, the site and building are being currently reconstructed. The adjacent properties have been developed with a mixture of uses. Northeast of the site lies the Public Employees Local 71 Building Association office, a single-family dwelling lies to the northwest, the Goldbelt Building to the southwest, and the Federal Building to the southeast. Heading further north lies the residential neighborhood of Casey Shattuck, while commercial uses line Glacier Avenue.

Project Design

The applicant's exterior design of the building is shown in Figure 2. As stated above under Background, only the second-story, northeast portion of the addition is the subject of the Conditional Use permit. By expanding this area to match the building's foot print, the side yard setback will not be met. This is shown on Sheet A201 of Attachment B. Staff notes that portions

of the existing second floor encroaches into the setback. Only the proposed northeastern corner requires a Conditional Use permit. The side property line is between the two buildings, as shown in Figure 3. The ground floor lawfully encroaches 6.5 feet into the 10-foot setback and the second floor would match it. The dimensions of the setback encroachment are 21' wide x 4' long = 84 square feet.



Figure 2. Drawing of the proposed building façade. Seong's Sushi Restaurant would remain on the right-side ground floor, two new commercial spaces would be created on the ground floor on the left side, and four new apartments would be created on the second floor.

The plans show new windows on the second floor within the side yard setback that will provide views of the Casey Shattuck neighborhood and Mt. Juneau. As seen in Figure 3, the closest building is the Public Employees office. This is a single-story building with windows along the same side property line. Due to the close distance between the two buildings and the second story of the subject building, a cavern effect is created and casts a shadow over the public employee's office building. This minimizes light and views from inside the ground floor windows. This cavern effect will likely continue with a denied Conditional Use permit because the second floor will be setback only 6.5 feet from the ground floor wall.

Approximately 20 feet of the western section of CJ Enterprises will be removed to create new parking spaces. Sections A101 & A102 of Attachment B provide a comparison between existing and proposed plans. This section of the building is depicted in Figure 3 with a white dotted line. This will allow some light into the westerly-facing windows of the office building. Regardless of the Conditional Use permit, some light and view sheds enjoyed by the office building may be further minimized.

Staff contacted the Public Employees Local 71 Building Association office for comments on the project. They indicated that their windows closest to the side property line do not afford them significant views or sunlight; the western windows on the end of the building provide these elements. They were supportive of the new parking lot as it may improve access along the alleyway. They did not have any negative comments with the overall project.

If the subject Conditional Use permit is denied, the northeastern corner of the second-story will need to be setback back 6 feet to meet the setback. In doing so, the second-story area will create a notch around the roof of the ground floor. This will result in a smaller apartment living room, odd building angles, and inefficient use of building space.

Overall, the ground floor height of the subject building is taller than the highest windows of the

public employees office building and will continue to cast a shadow. Having the second-story sit back 6 feet to meet the setback may not make any significant difference in the movement of light and air between the two buildings. Demolishing part of the ground floor of the building for future parking will create more space for the movement of light and air to the western, end side of the office building.

If the proposal is approved, staff would ensure the second story addition within the setback does not encroach closer than 3.5 feet to the side property line by requiring a surveyor to confirm the distance prior to framing inspection. Staff recommends this as a condition of approval.

Traffic

The building is located at a very busy traffic intersection of Glacier Avenue and West Ninth Street. Glacier Avenue is a major thoroughfare in the downtown area, linking large employment centers, entertainment places, Egan Drive and the Juneau/Douglas bridge. West Ninth Street, on the other hand, is typically its busiest during rush hour with traffic going to/ from the Federal Building and Post Office. In addition to high car volume, high pedestrian and city bus traffic exists due to the nearby City Capital Transit bus transfer station.

Automobile and pedestrian volume will slightly increase with the new apartments on the second floor. Since the addition within the setback will only enlarge the living area of one apartment, traffic volume would not change.

Parking and Circulation

As stated under Background, parking currently exists along Glacier Highway and will be entirely relocated along the alleyway to the west side of the property and comply with parking standards. The second floor addition in the side yard setback will have no impact to the parking and circulation on site.

Noise

The addition in the setback will afford the corner apartment a larger living room. Noise levels from this apartment will likely be of a typical small residence. More noise volume is anticipated to be generated from the ground floor commercial uses and adjacent businesses.

Public Health or Safety

The Building permit for the entire renovation BLD2012 522 meets local Building code for public health and safety, which includes Fire Department review. The walls along the side lot line will be reconstructed with fire resistant material, as required by the Building code and enforced during the Building permitting process.

Habitat

There is no habitat regulated by the Land Use Code that will be affected with the second-story addition in the side yard setback.

Property Value or Neighborhood Harmony

As stated earlier, the closest building to the second floor addition is the Public Employees Local 71 Building Association office. They did not have any negative concerns about the project. Other developed properties in the area are more distant from the setback and will not be significantly affected.

Conformity with Adopted Plans

The project was reviewed against the Title 49, Land Use Code, and the 2008 Comprehensive Plan of the City & Borough of Juneau.

Comprehensive Plan

The policies stated below promotes building compact development in urban areas, use the land efficiently, and allow flexibility and creative solutions for development in the urban service areas as indicated in the policies below.

POLICY 3.2. IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CBJ TO PROMOTE COMPACT URBAN DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE DESIGNATED URBAN SERVICE AREA TO ENSURE EFFICIENT UTILIZATION OF LAND RESOURCES AND TO FACILITATE COST EFFECTIVE PROVISION OF COMMUNITY SERVICES AND FACILITIES WHILE BALANCING PROTECTION OF NATURAL RESOURCES, FISH AND WILDLIFE HABITAT AND SCENIC CORRIDORS.

POLICY 10.2 IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CBJ TO ALLOW GREATER FLEXIBILITY AND A WIDER RANGE OF CREATIVE SOLUTIONS IN RESIDENTIAL AND MIXED USE LAND DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE URBAN SERVICE AREA.

POLICY 10.3 IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CBJ TO FACILITATE RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS OF VARIOUS TYPES AND DENSITIES THAT ARE APPROPRIATELY LOCATED IN RELATION TO SITE CONDITIONS, SURROUNDING LAND USES, AND CAPACITY OF PUBLIC FACILITIES AND TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS.

POLICY 10.4 IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CBJ TO MINIMIZE CONFLICTS BETWEEN RESIDENTIAL AREAS AND NEARBY RECREATIONAL, COMMERCIAL, OR INDUSTRIAL USES THAT WOULD GENERATE ADVERSE IMPACTS TO EXISTING RESIDENTIAL AREAS THROUGH APPROPRIATE LAND USE LOCATIONAL DECISIONS AND REGULATORY MEASURES.

As stated earlier, the Public Employees office did not find the proposed addition in the side yard setback would result in the reduction of the movement of light, air or view sheds nor other negative impacts. There will not likely be any increase in automobile and pedestrian traffic from

the addition in the setback. Staff finds the proposal to be consistent with the policies of the 2008 Comprehensive Plan of the City & Borough of Juneau.

Title 49, Land Use Code

As stated above, the purpose of CBJ § 49.25.430(4)(M) is to determine if the addition in the side yard setback will result in excessive blockage of views, excessive restriction of light and air, or other deleterious impacts. These elements are very similar to the purpose of yard setbacks. The subject building and the adjacent office building are very close to each other, which is likely a result of the lack of zoning setback standards during their construction period. Though the second story addition meeting the side yard setback will further limit the movement of air and light, the adjoining neighbor does not find the addition within the setback disconcerting due to other unobstructed windows along the backside of the building.

Fire separation and protection is a critical issue with buildings located so close to each other. The wall along the first and second floors closest to the side lot line of the subject building will contain fire resistant material to minimize harm to and from the adjacent office building. This is required by the Building Code and ensured through the submitted Building permit and site inspections.

Staff finds the proposed addition within the side yard setback does not aggravate any of the elements stated in CBJ § 49.25.430(4)(M), nor the purpose of yard setbacks.

FINDINGS

CBJ §49.15.330 (e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete;
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses; and,
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ §49.15.330 (f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or,

3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ §49.15.330 (e) & (f), Review of Director's & Commission's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

1. Is the application for the requested conditional use permit complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

Yes. The requested permit is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses. The permit is listed at CBJ §49.25.430(4)(M) *Additional Stories*.

3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

Yes. The proposed development complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the October 12th and 22nd issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section, and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the subject parcel, visible from the public Right of Way.

4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?

No. As stated earlier, the attached plans of the subject Conditional Use permit will be required to meet local building code. No other code issues pertain to the health or safety of the public. Therefore, the approval of this permit will not materially endanger the public's health or safety.

5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?

No. As indicated in the report, buildings in the neighborhood were built prior to current zoning standards and were not held to current yard setbacks. The proposed second floor addition within the side yard setback will not be closer to the property line than the first floor wall. This will allow greater efficiency of building space and material.

The closest building to the side yard setback that would be affected the most is the Public Employees Local 71 Building Association office. They did not have any negative comments with the proposal. Other developed properties would not be affected by the subject side yard setback encroachment. Therefore, with staff's recommended condition, the proposal will not decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the

neighboring area.

6. Will the proposed development be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

Yes. As stated above, the Land Use Code establishes a determination through code section CBJ § 49.25.430(4)(M) of whether the development will result in excessive blockage of views, excessive restriction of light and air, or other deleterious impacts. The owner of the closest building does not find the addition within the setback will significantly reduce the movement of light, air or view sheds due to other existing unobstructed windows. Staff finds that the project will not aggravate the elements listed under CBJ § 49.25.430(4)(M).

The purposes of yard setbacks are similar to CBJ § 49.25.430(4)(M) and additionally include separation for fire protection. As stated earlier, the proposed renovation of the subject building will be required to have fire resistant material along the side property line closest to the office building. Therefore, with the recommended condition, the project meets the purpose of yard setbacks and complies with the Land Use Code.

The 2008 Comprehensive Plan promotes compact, high efficiency development in urban areas of the borough. The applicant's design of the second floor area encroaches into the side yard setback atop of an existing ground floor space. This will fully utilize the overall foot print of the building and increase the efficiency of the development. Staff finds the project to be consistent with the 2008 Comprehensive Plan of the City & Borough of Juneau.

Per CBJ §49.70.900 (b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

7. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Program?

Not Applicable. No policies of the Juneau Coastal Management Program pertain to the proposal.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and grant the requested Conditional Use permit. The permit would allow the development of a second floor within the side yard setback. The approval is subject to the following condition:

1) Prior to framing inspection of the northeastern, second-story addition, a surveyor shall confirm that the wall is no closer than 3.5 feet away from the side property line.

Allowable/Conditional Use Permit Application Instructions

Pre-Application Conference: A pre-application conference is required prior to submitting an application. The applicant will meet with City & Borough of Juneau and Agency staff to discuss the proposed development, the permit procedure and to determine the application fees. To schedule a pre-application conference, please contact the Permit Center at 586-0770 or via e-mail at <u>Permits@ci.juneau.ak.us</u>.

Application: An application for an Allowable/Conditional Use Permit will not be accepted by the Community Development Department until it is determined to be complete. The items needed for a complete application are:

Forms: A completed Allowable/Conditional Use Permit Application and Development Permit Application form. The "land owner or lessee consent" signature <u>and</u> initials are <u>mandatory</u> on the Development Permit Application form.

Fees: The fee is dependent upon the class of the proposed use. Land Use fees generally range from \$300 to \$1,350. Any development, work or use done without a permit issued will be subject to double fees. All fees are subject to change.

Project Description: A detailed letter or narrative describing the project.

Plans: All plans are to be drawn to scale and clearly show the items listed below:

- A. Site plan, floor plan and elevation views of existing and proposed structures
- B. Existing and proposed parking areas, including dimensions of the spaces, aisle width and driveway entrances
- C. Proposed traffic circulation within the site including access/egress points and traffic control devices
- D. Existing and proposed lighting (including cut sheets for each type of lighting)
- E. Existing and proposed vegetation with location, area, height and type of plantings
- F. Existing physical features of the site (i.e. drainage, eagle trees, hazard areas, salmon streams, wetlands, etc.)

Document Format: All information that is submitted as part of an application shall be submitted in either of the following formats:

- B. Paper copies may not be larger than 11" X 17" (Unless a larger paper size is preapproved by the Community Development Department).

Application Review & Hearing Procedure: Once the application is determined to be complete, the Community Development Department will initiate the review and scheduling of the application. This process includes:

Review: As part of the review process the Community Development Department will evaluate the application for consistency with all applicable City & Borough of Juneau codes and adopted plans. Depending on unique characteristics of the permit request the application may be required to be reviewed by other municipal boards and committees. During this review period, the Community Development Department also sends all applications out for a 15-day agency review period. Review comments may require the applicant to provide additional information, clarification, or submit modifications/alterations for the proposed project.

Hearing: All Allowable/Conditional Use Permit Applications must be reviewed by the Planning Commission. Once an application has been deemed complete and has been reviewed by all applicable parties the Community Development Department will schedule the requested permit for the next appropriate meeting.

Public Notice Responsibilities: As part of the Allowable/Conditional Use permitting process, all permit requests must be given proper public notice, which consists of the following:

Community Development Department: Will give notice of the pending Planning Commission meeting and its agenda in the local newspaper a minimum of 10-days prior to the meeting. Furthermore, the department will mail abutters notices to all property owners within 500-feet of the project site.

Applicant: Will post a sign on the site at least 14-days prior to the meeting. The sign shall be visible from a public right-of-way or where determined to be appropriate by the Department. Signs may be produced by the Community Development Department for a preparation fee of \$50, and a \$100 deposit that will be refunded in full if the sign is returned by 4:30 p.m. on the Monday following the scheduled hearing date. If the sign is returned later than the Monday after the Planning Commission meeting, but within two weeks of the meeting, \$50.00 may be refunded. The applicant may make and erect their own sign. Please speak with the Community Development Department for more information.
