



BACKGROUND

By placing cameras at the Little Rock Dump along Thane Road, the State Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (DOT) plans to monitor vehicles and pedestrians passing through avalanche paths. The location is shown in the vicinity map above. Since the cameras will be placed on City property, DOT is seeking an easement for access and use of City land.

According to CBJ § 49.10.170 (c), the Planning Commission shall review all City land actions for consistency with the Comprehensive Plan and Capital Improvement Program (CIP), and provide a recommendation to the Assembly.

ANALYSIS

In attachment A, DOT explains that the cameras will monitor vehicles and pedestrians traveling in an avalanche area which will help them determine if a rescue operation is needed during an avalanche event.




Figure 1. The avalanche shown in the picture covers Thane Road and was intentionally released by DOT. This avalanche shoot is annually released to prevent natural slides from harming travelers along the road. Picture taken from downtown Douglas.

Staff notes that the largest avalanche next to the Little Rock Dump is Snowslide Creek. A picture of this avalanche is shown in Figure 1. DOT intentionally releases this avalanche several times a year to prevent natural releases of avalanches that could be harmful to Thane Road users.

The City Lands & Resources Director, Heather Marlow, indicates in Attachment B that the lease for DOT has been executed by the City Port Development, and is supported by the Docks & Harbors Board and the Assembly Lands Committee. Staff notes that the Docks & Harbors Department within the City manages the Little Rock Dump site.

CONFORMITY WITH ADOPTED PLANS

The 2008 Comprehensive Plan of the City & Borough of Juneau states that avalanches are a serious threat to human safety and development. The city has adopted avalanche maps and strict building regulations to minimize avalanche harm and encourage smart development.

The avalanches that are near the Little Rock Dump are hazardous to vehicles and pedestrians along Thane Road by covering the road way. Further, these avalanches can easily block the road and trap travelers and residents of the Thane Neighborhood and other individuals in the area. With the road being blocked, emergency access would be limited.

Though the Comprehensive Plan states several policies for avalanche safety and control, as well as safe development, the following policy is specifically germane to the proposal:

POLICY 7.17. IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CBJ TO MINIMIZE THE THREAT TO HUMAN SAFETY AND DEVELOPMENT POSED BY LANDSLIDES (MASS WASTING) AND AVALANCHES.

Allowing DOT to use City land for the purposes of avalanche safety is consistent with the 2008 Comprehensive Plan of the City & Borough of Juneau.

HABITAT

There are no habitat protected by the Land Use Code that will be affected by the proposed lease.

FINDINGS

In addition to the positive recommendations from the Docks & Harbors Dept. and the Assembly Lands Committee, staff finds the proposal to be consistent with adopted plans.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt the above findings and recommend the Assembly approval of the proposed City-State Project review, which would allow an easement on City land for DOT's cameras to monitor traffic along Thane Road during avalanche events, accordance with the Project Description


Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT) is planning to install cameras along Thane Road. The purpose of the Thane Road Avalanche Camera Project is to install a series of up to six cameras to monitor the entrance and exit points of the three avalanche zones along Thane Road. These cameras will provide a stream of images to monitoring sites at DOT/PF and CBJ emergency services centers. In the event of an avalanche, emergency services personnel can review the images for a short time period just prior to the avalanche and determine if any vehicles or pedestrians had entered the avalanche areas and not exited before the avalanche occurred. This will help emergency service personnel to decide if a rescue operation is required.

DOT needs a 170 square foot permanent easement on property owned by the City and Borough of Juneau (City). See attached drawing.

Given the benefit to the City of the improvement from this project, I would inquire that the City donates the necessary easement. Under 23 C.F.R. 710.505 – 23 C.F.R. 710.507, you are entitled to receive just compensation for the property and that you have the right to an appraisal. DOT has determined that no appraisal is necessary because the value is estimated not to be more than \$10,000. The following language will also be part of our documentation:

"The City and Borough of Juneau hereby elects to donate certain interest in real property to the (DOT/PF) for the Thane Road RWIS project #80826 / FHWA STP-0106(043) referenced as parcel E-3B. The donation is made voluntarily and with full knowledge of our entitlement to receive just compensation. The City also releases DOT/PF from the obligation of preparing an appraisal of this donated parcel."




SUBJECT: ADOT Thane Road Camera Easement

ADOT has requested the use of approximately 170 square feet of municipal property, at the Little Rock Dump, to install a camera to monitor the adjacent avalanche shoot on Thane Road. The request is also likely to require provisions for access, relocation and utilities.

The CBJ executed a lease for the property with Juneau Port Development. The ADOT request is supported by the lease holder and the Docks and Harbors Board. At its October 29, 2012 meeting the Assembly Lands Committee forwarded a motion of support to the Assembly for the easement. The Planning Commission recommendation will also be forwarded to the Assembly for consideration.
