



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant requests a Conditional Use permit for the development of a 599 square foot detached accessory apartment. A Conditional Use Permit is required because the lot is not served by public sewer, in accordance with City and Borough of Juneau Land Use Code, CBJ §49.25.510(d)(2)(G)(ii).

The lot currently has a one story, three bedroom single-family home with a detached garage. The applicant has provided a letter of approval from the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) for a replacement septic system that will be sufficient to serve a three bedroom house and a one bedroom "cottage" or apartment.

ANALYSIS

Project Site and Design

The site is located in a D-3 residential zoning district on a waterfront lot next to Stephens Passage accessible by an access road off of Glacier Highway. The lot size is 16,117 square feet which exceeds the 12,000 square foot minimum lot size for the D-3 zoning district.

The applicant has proposed a 599 square foot accessory apartment (Attachment C). The project meets all other requirements of the Accessory Apartment Ordinance, in the City and Borough of Juneau's Land Use Code, CBJ §49.25.510(d)(2). The applicant has supplied a letter of approval from ADEC regarding replacement of current septic system with a septic system adequate for the three bedroom existing home and the proposed one bedroom accessory apartment (Attachment E).

Traffic, Parking, and Circulation

The proposed project has adequate space for parking and meets the parking requirements for a single-family home and accessory apartment. The parking requirements for this property are three parking spaces; two for the single-family home and one for the accessory apartment. Please see Attachment C for proposed parking.

The property is served by an access road off of Glacier Highway. This access road serves as the primary traffic for a number of homes to the west of the subject property. The site is also accessed by a couple flights of stairs to Glacier Highway above the home. Please see Attachment D for photos of existing site.

Noise

The proposed development will not generate significant noise. The lot meets density requirements to accommodate an accessory apartment.

Public Health or Safety

ADEC has approved the proposed replacement septic system for the development, which has the capacity to support a three bedroom home and a one bedroom apartment. Public health and safety concerns from a private septic system have been addressed. Staff is unaware of any other public health or safety issues associated with the proposed development. Staff recommends the following condition to assure that the replacement septic system is installed:

1. Prior to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the accessory apartment, the applicant must provide documentation from the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation, stating that an on-site wastewater disposal system, with the appropriate rated capacity, has been installed.

Habitat

There are no habitat issues associated with this development.

Property Value or Neighborhood Harmony

No evidence indicates that the proposed development will have a negative impact on property value or neighborhood harmony. The development meets all requirements for accessory apartments, and the 16,117 square foot lot is larger than the 12,000 square foot minimum lot size in the D-3 zoning district.

Conformity with Adopted Plans

The project substantially conforms to the 2008 Juneau Comprehensive Plan Policy 4.1 as follows:

Policy 4.1 It is the policy of the CBJ to facilitate the provision and maintenance of safe, sanitary, and affordable housing for its residents.

The proposed development meets the intent of this policy by providing an accessory apartment on a lot with an approved private septic system.

FINDINGS

CBJ §49.15.330 (e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete;
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses; and,
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ §49.15.330 (f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based

upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or,
- 3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ §49.15.330 (e) & (f), Review of Director's & Commission's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

1. Is the application for the requested conditional use permit complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

Yes. The requested permit is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses. The permit is listed at CBJ §49.25.300, Section 1.130 for the D-3 zoning district.

3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

Yes. The proposed development complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the March 1, 2013 and March 11, 2013 issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section, and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the subject parcel, visible from the public Right of Way.

4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?

No. As described in the preceding analysis, available evidence indicates that the proposed development will not materially endanger the public health or safety. The proposed septic system has been approved by the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation. To ensure the proposed development does not endanger the public health or safety a condition of approval has been recommended by staff that prior to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the accessory apartment, the applicant must provide documentation from the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation stating that an on-site wastewater disposal system, with the appropriate rated capacity, has been installed.

5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?

No. As described in the preceding analysis, no evidence indicates that the development will

substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with the property in the neighboring area.

6. Will the proposed development be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

Yes. The proposed development meets the intent of the 2008 Juneau Comprehensive Plan, specifically Policy 4.1 regarding provision of affordable housing.

Per CBJ §49.70.900 (b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

7. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Program?

Not applicable.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and grant the requested Conditional Use permit. The permit would allow the development of a 599 square foot detached accessory apartment on a lot that is not served by public sewer.

With the following condition:

1. Prior to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the accessory apartment, the applicant must provide documentation from the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation stating that an on-site wastewater disposal system, with the appropriate rated capacity, has been installed.



Dear Mr. Hayden:

The department has reviewed the engineering plans submitted for the referenced project. Conditional approval is hereby given to construct the proposed engineered system on the referenced property. The existing septic system will be replaced with a 600 GPD, Naydic M-1050A (or like Jet) secondary treatment plant followed by an existing marine outfall at minus 4' (verification of proper piping to submitted to ADEC for FATO approval), as per the latest design plans submitted ADEC. The system serves a three (3) bedroom house and a one bedroom cottage. The system has an estimated maximum wastewater generation of 600 gallons per day.

Included with your engineering plans is a request to waive the minimum separation distance required under 18 AAC 72.020. The Department has reviewed the engineered plans and hereby grants a waiver to allow for a reduced separation of approximately 40' between the MHHW line and the treatment system.

Advisories and Recommendations:

- 1. This construction approval is valid for two years. If the project is not constructed within two years, new plans and associated fees must be submitted to ADEC for review and approval.
- 2. This approval is contingent upon compliance with the conditions of Wastewater Disposal Regulations, 18 AAC 72.235, Construction Certification. The noted section of the regulations requires that a "Certification of Construction" be completed and submitted to the Department within ninety (90) days of completion of construction. Record drawings, submitted by your engineer, must indicate any changes or deviations from the approved plans to facilitate final review. A "Certification of Construction" form is enclosed for your use.
- 3. This approval is contingent upon your receipt of any other state, federal or local authorizations which are required for your project. You are required to obtain all other necessary authorizations before proceeding with your project.
