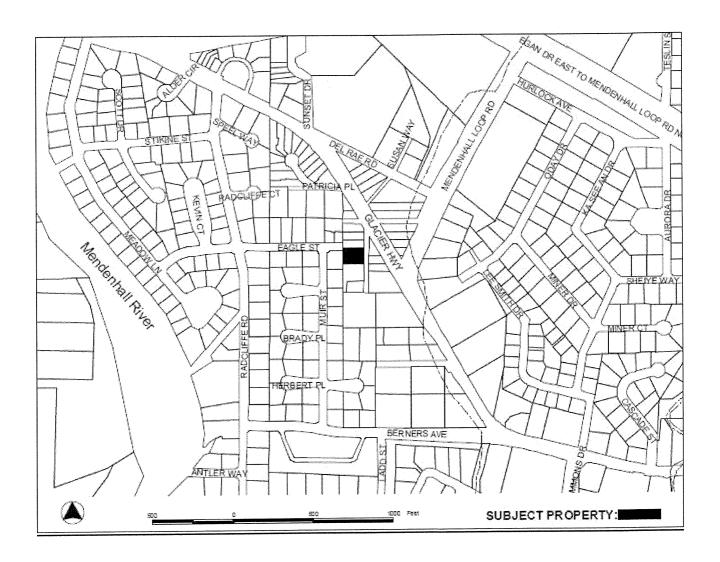

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant requests a Conditional Use permit for the development of a Veterinarian Clinic in an existing vacant building. The proposed clinic would be approximately 1,400 square feet or approximately half of the first floor of the building at 2201 Dunn Street. A Conditional Use Permit is required for a Veterinary Clinic in the Light Commercial zoning district in which the building is located, per the City and Borough of Juneau's Land Use Code in the Table of Permissible Uses, CBJ 49.25.300.12.000 Services and Enterprises Related to Animals, 12.100 Veterinary Clinic.

This proposal is based on the applicant's desire to open their own Veterinarian practice and to serve the community's need for another veterinarian clinic. The proposed clinic would be called Tongass Veterinary Services, and would be a one doctor, dog and cat, small animal hospital to serve Juneau's pets. Greater than 90% of the proposed business would be a simple outpatient clinic with clients coming for short appointments. The applicant states also "The only animals housed in the clinic will be the occasional hospitalized patient due to severe illness. I just want to make it clear that I'm not in the business of housing animals."

ANALYSIS

Project Site and Design - The site is located in a Light Commercial zoning district on Dunn Street off of Glacier Highway. The lot size is 10,400 square feet and is surrounded by light commercial development on the east, north and south. To the west of the lot is a D-5 residential zoning district and a single-family home.

The proposed clinic would consist of a reception area with product sales, 3 examination rooms, a storage room, an operation room, an area to hold animals, a break room, and a bathroom.

Traffic, Parking and Circulation – The facility will be accessed via Dunn Street off of Glacier Highway. The proposed project has adequate space for parking and meets the parking requirements for a medical clinic. The parking requirement for Medical clinics per the City and Borough of Juneau's Land Use Code, CBJ 49.40.210 Minimum Space and Dimensional Standards for Parking and Off-street Loading (a) Table of minimum parking standards states 1 parking space per 200 square feet of gross floor area. The proposed clinic would be 1,400 square feet, thus the clinic is required to provide seven spaces. Please see Attachment D for proposed parking.

Noise – The proposed development might bring up some concerns about noise of barking dogs. This is mitigated by the clinic only having occasional overnight hospitalized animals. Animals will only be overnighted on occasion due to severe illness. Staff proposes conditions of approval for the proposed development; condition one (1) that no animals shall be left overnight in the facility except for severe medical reasons, and condition two (2) that after hours contact information shall be prominently posted on the outside of the building, so that in case of noise from overnighted dogs that the clinic can be contacted. These conditions would mitigate the potential noise issue.

Public Health or Safety – There are no public health or safety issues associated with this development.

Habitat – There are no habitat issues associated with this development.

Property Value or Neighborhood Harmony – Available evidence indicates that the proposed clinic will maintain property value and neighborhood harmony, as long as the clinic does not house or kennel dogs overnight. The proposal and intent of the applicant is to only on occasion have animals overnight due to severe illness and need of hospitalization.

Conformity with Adopted Plans – The project substantially conforms to the 2008 Juneau Comprehensive Plan in Policy 13.3 as follows:

POLICY 13.3 TO PROMOTE QUALITY MEDICAL AND SOCIAL SERVICES IN THE CBJ TO ENSURE THE SAFETY, HEALTH, WELL-BEING AND SELF-SUFFICIENCY OF ITS RESIDENTS.

The proposed development meets the intent of this policy by providing health care to Juneau pets.

FINDINGS

CBJ §49.15.330 (e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete;
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses; and,
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ §49.15.330 (f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or
- 3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ §49.15.330 (e) & (f), Review of Director's & Commission's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

1. Is the application for the requested conditional use permit complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

Yes. The requested permit is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses. The permit is listed at CBJ §49.25.300, Section 12.100 for the Light Commercial zoning district.

3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

Yes. The proposed development complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the March 29, 2013 and April 8, 2013 issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section, and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the subject parcel, visible from the public Right of Way.

4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?

No. As described in the preceding analysis, available evidence indicates that the proposed development will not materially endanger the public health or safety.

5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?

No. As described in the above analysis the applicant does not plan to "board" animals in the proposed veterinarian clinic, the occasional overnight patient will be considered due to "severe illness" and need for overnight hospitalization; thus there is no evidence to conclude that the proposed development would substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area. Staff has proposed two conditions to minimize noise impact to adjacent properties: First, condition one, that no animals shall be left overnight in the facility except for severe medical reasons; and second, condition two, after hours contact information shall be prominently posted on the outside of the building.

6. Will the proposed development be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

Yes. The proposed development meets the intent of the 2008 Juneau Comprehensive Plan, specifically Policy 13.3 regarding community services.

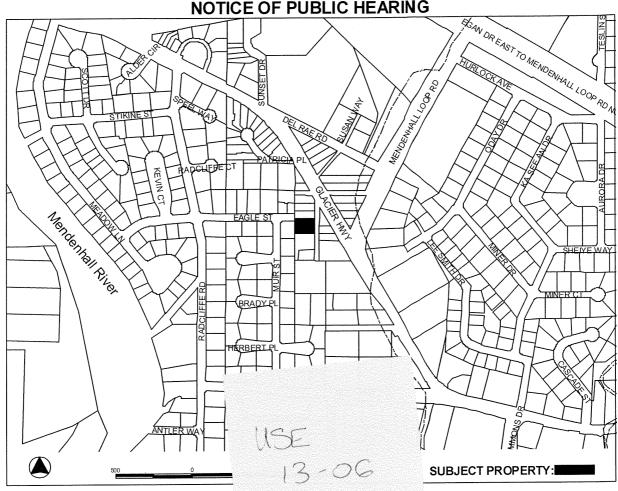

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and grant the requested Conditional Use permit. The permit would allow the development of an approximately 1,400 square foot Veterinarian Clinic at 2201 Dunn Street, with the following recommended conditions:

- 1. No animals shall be left overnight in the facility except for severe medical reasons.
- 2. After hours contact information shall be prominently posted on the outside of the building.

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to serve in support of the allowable use permit for Tongass Veterinary Services. My name is Sam Smith and I'm a local veterinarian. I have been practicing in Juneau and southeast Alaska as a veterinarian for 2 years. I want to open a small animal hospital in Juneau. This community's pets needs another clinic. I am currently planning to rent a commercial space on Dunn St. from RH Development, and pay to finish out the interior as a small veterinary clinic.

I understand an allowable use permit is required for any business having anything to do with animals. I just want to clarify what it is I do to facilitate this permit being issued. I am planning to change Smith Equine, a mobile horse practice, into Tongass Veterinary Services (TVS).

TVS will be a small, one doctor dog and cat clinic serving Juneau's pets. It is not, in any way, a dog boarding or grooming facility. There will not be a group of obnoxious animals acting as a nuisance in the neighborhood. Greater than 90% of my business will be on a simple outpatient basis with clients coming and going for short appointments. The only animals housed in the clinic will be the occasional hospitalized patient due to severe illness. I just want to make it clear that I'm not in the business of housing animals. If they're not ill enough to be hospitalized, I don't want them staying in the facility for any extended period of time. Likewise, there will not be an issue with dog and cat waste around the perimeter of the facility. Occasionally a hospitalized patient will need to go around back of the building, and this will be cleaned by my staff immediately. Furthermore, I can't foresee any risks or threats my conducting business as a veterinarian could have to the surrounding small businesses in the area.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask me. I'm more than happy to give explanation regarding anything I plan to do.
