The Board of Adjustment, at its regular public meeting, adopted the analysis and findings listed in the attached memorandum dated May 8, 2013, and made additional findings (see below) to approve the Variance to be conducted as described in the project description and project drawings submitted with the application and with the following condition:

1. A maintenance easement be defined at a width of 20 feet at the street that shall be recorded prior to the common-wall subdivision plat.

## New Findings made by Board of Adjustment during hearing

- 1. Approving the reduced side yard setback and minimum lot width for a future common-wall development will allow the creation of two, separate fee simple-properties which will result in one single family dwelling on each lot. This will be consistent with the existing single-family neighborhood.
- 5 (B) & 5(C): To comply will all common-wall standards, the applicant would need to buy land to increase the lot width and side yard setback. This would be unreasonably expensive. Further, the property is located along the backside of a street corner which creates a unique physical feature of the property and renders compliance with all common-wall standards burdensome.
- 6. Approving the variance to allow the duplex to be subdivided into a common-wall development will result in two low cost single-family homes in a restricted residential market. The neighborhood will benefit from the creation of two, fee-simple homes.

Does the variance as requested, meet the criteria of Section 49.20.250, Grounds for Variances?

Yes. All criterions are met, therefore, the variance meets Section CBJ § 49.20.250.
