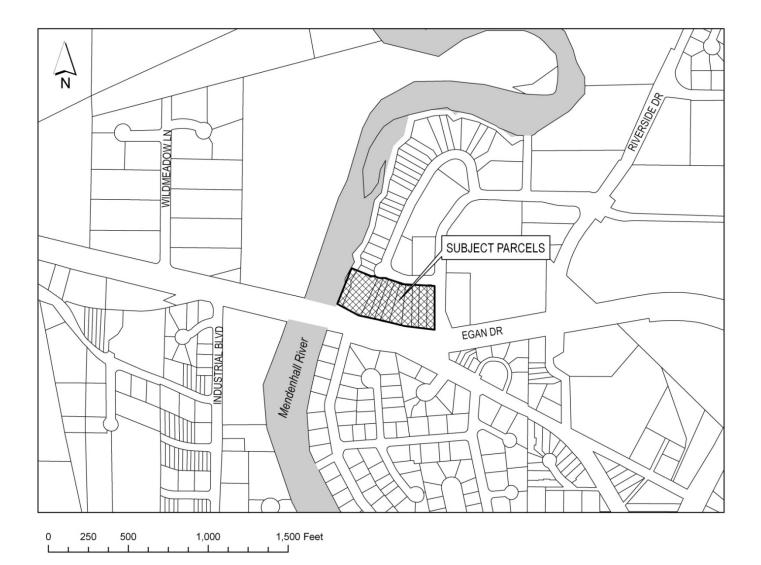

BACKGROUND

The proposed subdivision would adjust the lot lines of eleven existing lots and create one new right-of-way lot from the area removed from the existing lots. The purpose of this right-of-way acquisition is to accommodate a widened approach to the Brotherhood Bridge on Egan Drive/Glacier Highway. The bridge replacement and other related infrastructure improvements are considered concurrently with this subdivision under CSP2013 0011.

49.15.430 - Major subdivisions.

The major subdivision procedures shall be used for subdivision of a parcel into five or more lots, including the resubdivision of existing parcels into five or more lots or the adjustment of the boundary of five or more parcels. Major subdivision approval shall be a two-step process. The first step shall consist of preliminary plat approval and construction authorization by the commission pursuant to the conditional use permit process set out in section 49.15.330. The second step shall be approval of the final plat by the commission pursuant to section 49.15.440.

Typically, major subdivisions must be reviewed in a two-step process, as the first step (preliminary plat) ensures that the Planning Commission has approved the proposed subdivision's development; that is, prior to the developer constructing roads, utilities, and other infrastructure, the Planning Commission must review and approve the placement and design of that infrastructure. Once the preliminary approval has been granted, the developer must then either construct or bond for the construction of all required infrastructure prior to final plat approval, after which the plat is recorded and the new lots created.

In the proposed project, no new infrastructure is required as part of the subdivision; the privately owned lots remaining after the right-of-way acquisition will still be accessed from within Vintage Business Park on Clinton Drive, and no new utility services or other infrastructure are required as part of this subdivision. Furthermore, the proposed improvements within the right-of-way acquired in this subdivision cannot be constructed until the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) has taken ownership of the right-of-way, which cannot occur until the lot has been created and sold to DOT&PF by its current owner, William Bauer.

Accordingly, the proposed subdivision is being reviewed as a combined preliminary and final plat.

Vintage Business Park, the project location, is the subject of seven ordinances adopted by the City and Borough of Juneau Assembly: 84-03(am), 84-35(am), 85-33, 85-55, 85-89, 86-54(am), and 86-72. These ordinances have, in combination: rezoned the property to its current zoning, set design standards for buildings within Vintage Business Park, set landscaping standards for properties and roadways in Vintage Business Park, required financial support of off-site improvements, and more. Because each new ordinance repealed portions of prior ordinances while adopting new language, it is very difficult to determine the language that is still in effect from each ordinance as a stand-alone document. In order to make sense of these seven overlapping ordinances, staff re-drafted the ordinances into a single document that shows all of the historical and current language. Included with this memorandum as Attachment C, this "master ordinance" shows original language in normal font, deleted font struck through, and new text underlined. Because of the many layers of these ordinances, some text appears as both underlined and struck through; this is text that was adopted after the original ordinance, 84-03(am), and then later repealed or replaced. Although this "master ordinance" has not been adopted in this form, it has been reviewed by the CBJ Law Department and found to be an accurate rendering of the currently-adopted ordinances that control development in Vintage Business Park. This "master" ordinance is not intended to be adopted, but was created in order to clarify what is in effect today.

These ordinances are uniformly described as relating to "the site plan entitled 'Vintage Business Park' by Thomas and Greiner, Architects, dated December 9, 1983." The proposed project would amend the boundary of Vintage Business Park, and would therefore amend the site plan referenced in all seven relevant ordinances. Staff initially interpreted this situation to mean that the Assembly would need to adopt an eighth ordinance amending the Vintage Business Park boundary; however, ordinance serial number 86-54(am) included a provision in Attachment A, Section H, providing for Planning Commission or Design Review Board review and approval of any further changes to Vintage Business Park (Attachments C and D).

ANALYSIS

Zoning-

The project site, Vintage Business Park, is zoned Light Commercial (LC), but it was not so zoned in a typical or straightforward manner. The rezoning ordinance and its amendments include a project site plan and place design, use, and circulation restrictions on the subject area.

Drainage-

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities proposes to amend drainage as part of the Brotherhood Bridge replacement project; the Right-of-Way acquired through this subdivision will be used for drainage improvements, among other improvements. CBJ Chief Regulatory Surveyor Ron King has reviewed the plans for revisions to drainage in this area and did not have any comments.

Wetlands-

No wetlands will be impacted by the proposed subdivision.

<u>Habitat</u>-

. . .

The Mendenhall River is a cataloged anadromous water body and development along it is subject to habitat setbacks at CBJ 49.70.310(a) and (b), as well as at CBJ 49.70.950(f). CBJ 49.70.925 addresses bridges, which must cross rivers and streams by their very nature:

49.70.925 - Transportation and utilities.

(b) Where roads and trails cross anadromous streams, the design and construction of bridges and culverts shall allow free passage of fish, and shall take all feasible and prudent steps to prevent habitat disturbance. Phasing of construction shall be done to avoid critical migration periods for salmon and other anadromous species.

The proposed subdivision would not affect habitat, although the related project to widen the Brotherhood Bridge will. Bridge-related construction permits will be required from the United States Army Corps of Engineers, the United States Marine Fisheries Service, and the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, among others. Construction will be phased to avoid critical migration periods for salmon and other anadromous species, taking all feasible and prudent steps to prevent habitat disturbance. These impacts are further discussed in the memorandum for CSP2013 0011.

Access-

The proposed subdivision would result in the reduction in depth and area of 11 existing lots and the creation of a new Right-of-Way lot; the existing access to the 11 existing lots would not be affected, and the Right-of-Way lot would be used to accommodate a widened Glacier Highway.

Traffic Analysis-

The proposed subdivision would not affect traffic, although the Right-of-Way lot created would be used to accommodate a widened Glacier Highway.

Pedestrian Access-

The proposed subdivision would result in a new Right-of-Way lot that would be used to accommodate a relocated multi-use path and the entrance to a new underpass along the east bank of the Mendenhall River. The proposed subdivision would not in and of itself affect pedestrian access.

FINDINGS

CBJ 49.15.330(e)(1), Review of Director's Determinations, states that the Planning Commission shall review the Director's report to consider:

- 1. Whether the application is complete; and,
- 2. Whether the proposed use is appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses;
- 3. Whether the development as proposed will comply with the other requirements of this chapter.

The Commission shall adopt the Director's determination on the three items above unless it finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the Director's determination was in error, and states its reasoning for each finding with particularity.

CBJ 49.15.330(f), Commission Determinations, states that even if the Commission adopts the Director's determination, it may nonetheless deny or condition the permit if it concludes, based upon its own independent review of the information submitted at the public hearing, that the development will more probably than not:

- 1. Materially endanger the public health or safety;
- 2. Substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area; or,
- 3. Not be in general conformity with the comprehensive plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans.

Per CBJ 49.15.300(e)(1)(A through C), Review of Director's Determinations, the Director makes the following findings on the proposed development:

1. Is the application for the requested conditional use permit complete?

Yes. We find the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

2. Is the proposed use appropriate according to the Table of Permissible Uses?

Not Applicable. Subdivisions are not a use listed in the Table of Permissible Uses.

3. Will the proposed development comply with the other requirements of this chapter?

Yes. The proposed subdivision complies with the other requirements of this chapter. Public notice of this project was provided in the June 14, 2013 and June 24, 2013 issues of the Juneau Empire's "Your Municipality" section, and a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property

owners within 500 feet of the subject parcel. Moreover, a Public Notice Sign was posted on the subject parcel, visible from the public right of way.

4. Will the proposed development materially endanger the public health or safety?

No. The proposed subdivision will allow the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to reconstruct the Brotherhood Bridge so as to accommodate acceleration and deceleration lanes as well as non-motorized transportation lanes and an underpass in a design consistent with geometric specifications adopted by the State of Alaska. The proposed development will not materially endanger the public health or safety.

5. Will the proposed development substantially decrease the value of or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area?

No. The proposed Right-of-Way lot will be purchased at a negotiated price from the property owner. There is no evidence in the record that the proposed development will impact or be out of harmony with property in the neighboring area.

6. Will the proposed development <u>not</u> be in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans?

No. The proposed widening of the Brotherhood Bridge and Glacier Highway approach to the eastern side of the Brotherhood Bridge is in general conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan, or other officially adopted plans. See the memorandum on CSP2013 0011 for further discussion.

Per CBJ 49.70.900(b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

7. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Program?

Yes. The proposed development complies with the Juneau Coastal Management Program.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt the Director's analysis and findings and approve the requested Preliminary and Final Plat, with the effect of amending "the site plan entitled 'Vintage Business Park' by Thomas and Greiner, Architects, dated December 9, 1983", as authorized by ordinance serial number 86-54(am), Attachment A, Section H.

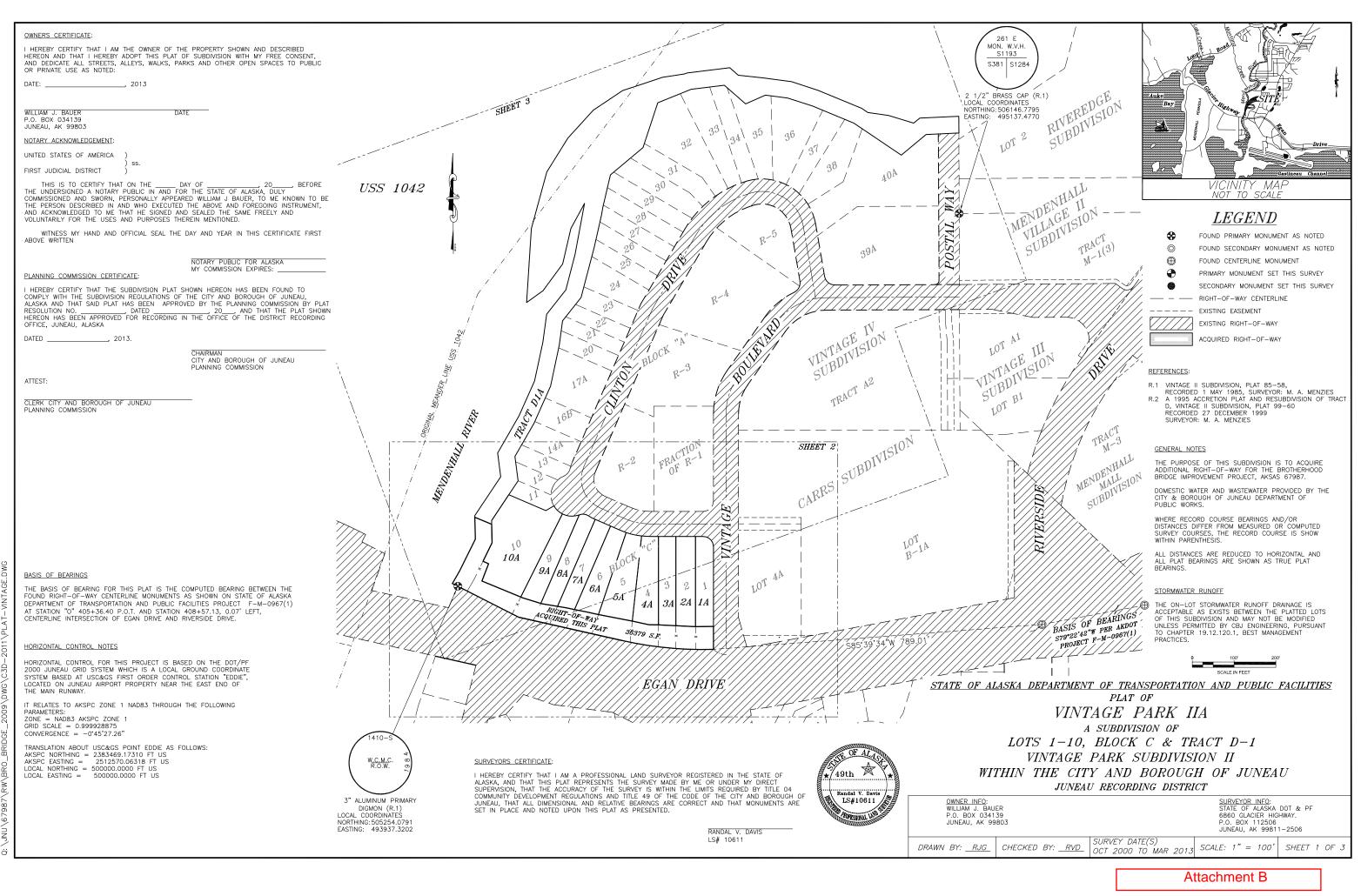

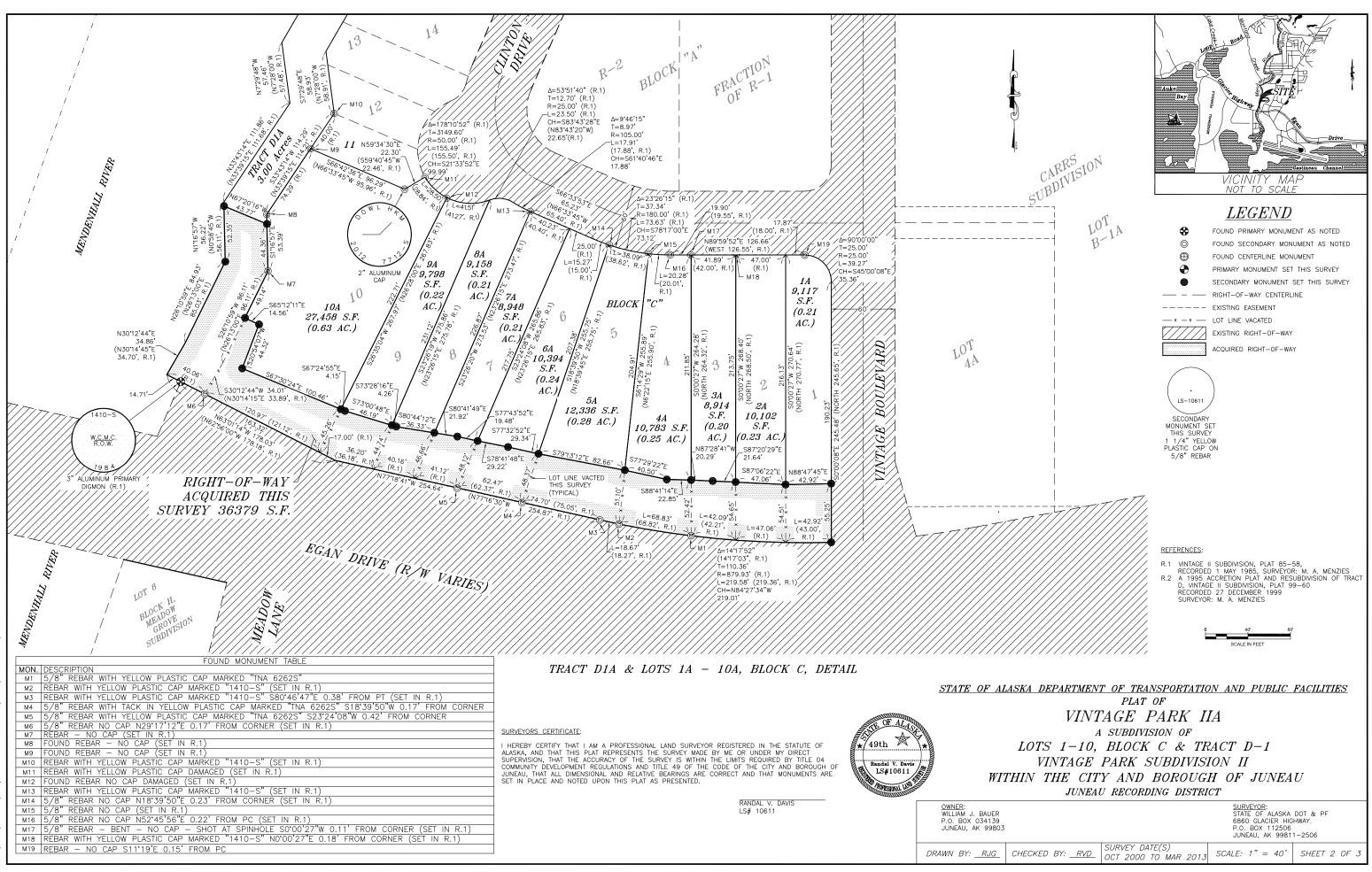

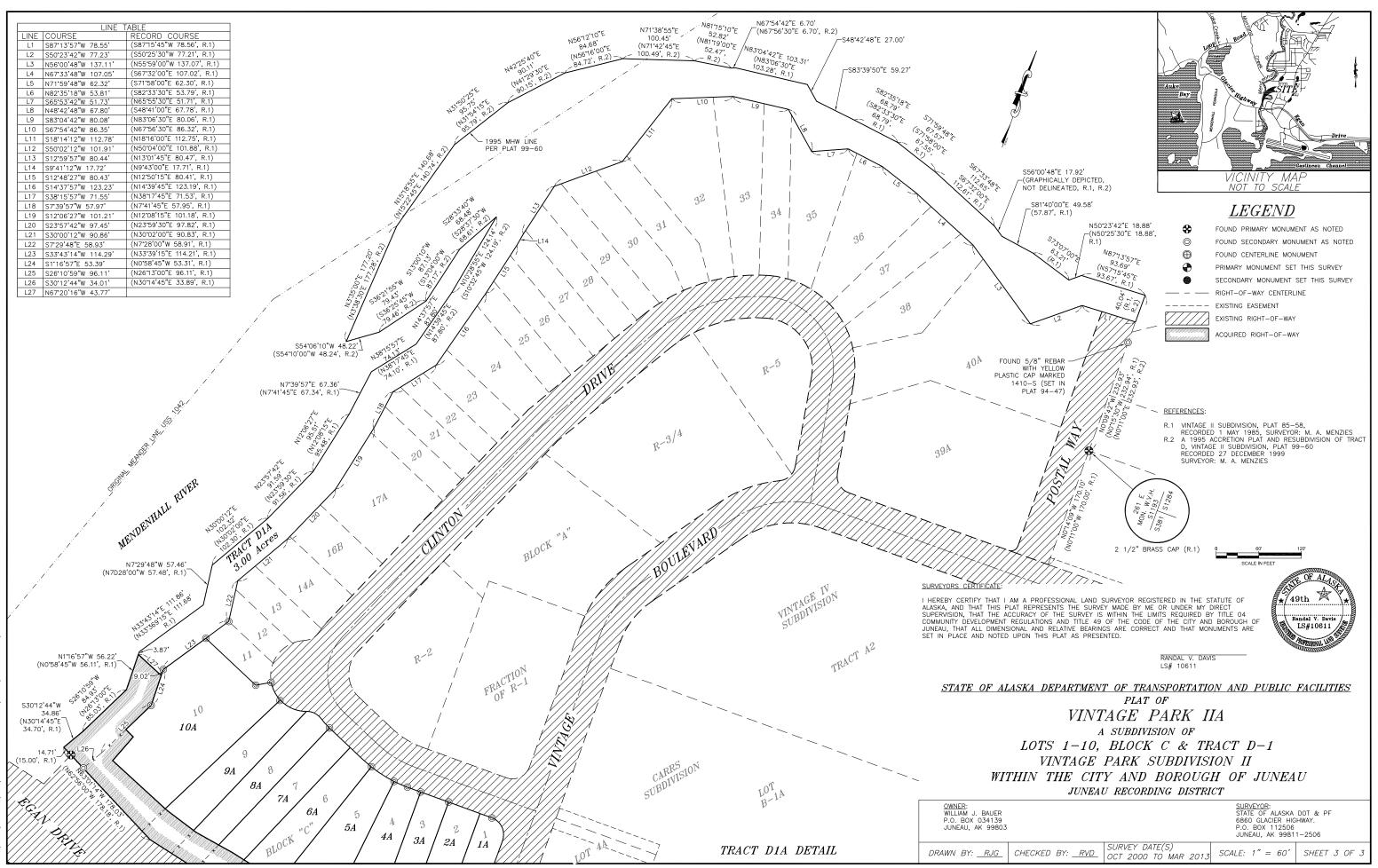

Section 3. Approval of Plan.

(a) The <u>site plan entitled</u> "Vintage Business Park" by Thomas and Greiner, Architects, dated December 9, 1983, subject to the conditions set out in the memorandum of December 15, 1983, to the assembly from Thomas J. Peterson Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein, is approved as the development plan for the subject property; provided, the site plan is amended to close off the access from Egan Expressway into Vintage Boulevard for the present, but the assembly reserves the right to reconsider allowing access at that point as the park develops. <u>except, that the site plan is amended to include the establishment of two family style restaurants on Lot 4, Block B and Lot 39, Block C of Vintage II Subdivision, (Plat 85–58), and on page 3 of the Peterson memorandum, the following changes are made to subsection D, Signage:</u>

In the fourth line, the phrase "office/retail" is changed to read "office" and in the fifth and sixth lines, the word "commercial" is changed to read "commercial/retail".

; provided, the site plan is amended as follows:

- (1) To include a twenty foot building setback from the easterly and the southerly boundariesy of the subject property;¹
- (2) To include a ten foot building setback for frontage on internal rights-ofway;
- (3) To include as the development setback line from the Mendenhall River, the inland, easterly edge of the asphalt bike path as such path existed on September 9, 1986;
- (4) To include Lots 4, 5, and 6, Block A, in the Vintage Business Park so as to include setbacks, height restrictions, and other similar restrictions;²
- (5) To include a fifteen foot building setback from the easterly boundary of lots 4, 5, and 6, Block A, and the northeasterly boundary of Lot 6, Block $\underline{A};^{3}$
- (6) The southerly and easterly boundaries of Lots 4, 5, and 6, Block A, be landscaped with a double row of spruce trees twenty feet wide along Egan Drive and fifteen feet wide along Riverside Drive.⁴

(b) In those areas where the bike path is located more than twenty feet from the inland edge of Tract D (between Lots 22 through 35 of Block C, Vintage Park Subdivision), as set forth on Plat 85-58, recorded in the Juneau Recording District on May 1, 1985, the developer may relocate the bike path to any location outside of the inland side of Tract D, provided the developer has obtained a permit from the Army Corps of Engineers and any other necessary permits. Upon such relocation of the bike path, the new development setback line shall be the inland, easterly edge of the relocated bike path.

(c) Exhibit "A" further provides for an expedited process for review of certain adjustments to the development plan in the course of completing the project, pursuant to CBJ 49.25.502(e)(2)⁵. The authority to conduct such a review is delegated by Exhibit "A" to the appropriate municipal agency and procedures are established, including that if the adjustments are resolved to the satisfaction of the agency and the applicant, review by a higher authority is not required.⁶

Section 4. Effective Date of Zone Change. This zone change shall become effective on the latter of:

That the applicant has entered into an agreement with the City and Borough of Juneau and Glacier Village Super Market Inc. requiring the three parties applicant to bear equally the cost of Riverside Drive-Vintage Road signalization less state and federal funding at such time as the State of Alaska

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 84-03(am), AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE SERIAL NOS. 84-35, 85-33, 85-55, AND 85-89, TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPROVAL OF A REVISED DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR VINTAGE BUSINESS PARK.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

* Section 1. <u>Classification</u>. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the city and borough code.

* Section 2. <u>Repeal and Reenactment of Section</u>. Section 3 of Ordinance Serial No. 84-03(am), as amended by Ordinance Serial Nos. 84-35, 85-33, and 85-55, is repealed and reenacted to read:

> Approval of Plan. (a) * Section 3. The site plan entitled "Vintage Business Park" by Thomas and Greiner, Architects, dated December 9, 1983, subject to the Exhibit "A" out in conditions set by hereto and incorporated attached is approved as reference herein, the development plan for the subject provided, the site plan is property; amended as follows:

> (1) To include a twenty foot building setback from the easterly and the southerly boundaries of the subject property;

> (2) To include a ten foot building setback for frontage on internal rights-of-way;

> (3) To include as the development setback line from the Mendenhall River, the inland, easterly edge of the asphalt bike path as such path existed on September 9, 1986.



(b) In those areas where the bike path is located more than twenty feet from the inland edge of Tract D (between Lots 22 through 35 of Block C, Vintage Park Subdivision), as set forth on Plat 85-58, recorded in the Juneau Recording District on May 1, 1985, the developer relocate the bike path to any mav location outside of the inland side of Tract D, provided the developer has obtained a permit from the Army Corps of other necessary any Engineers and Upon such relocation of the permits. bike path, the new development setback line shall be the inland, easterly edge of the relocated asphalt bike path.

(c) Exhibit "A" further provides for expedited process for review of an certain adjustments to the development plan in the course of completing the project, pursuant to CBJ 49.25.502(e)(2). The authority to conduct such review is delegated by Exhibit "A" to the appropriate municipal and agency procedures are established, including that if the adjustments are resolved to the satisfaction of the agency and the applicant, review by a higher authority is not required.

* Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the later of:

(a) Thirty days after the date of its adoption, or

(b) The date upon which the director of the planning department certifies

(1) that the amended site plan for Vintage Business Park has been approved by the planning director, and

(2) that condition G, Slope Protection, set forth in Exhibit "A" to this ordinance has been resolved to the satisfaction of the applicant, the planning department, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, and the Army Corps of Engineers. Adopted this 9th day of September, 1986.

A. TRAFFIC

- 1. Site Access and Egress
 - (a) Intersection of Haul Road and Egan Drive Access from Egan Expressway shall be limited to a right turn in and a right turn out only. No other access from Egan Drive shall be allowed.
 - Intersection of Vintage Boulevard and Riverside Drive Access from Riverside Drive and Vintage (b) Boulevard is allowed, subject to the applicant entering into an agreement with the City and Borough of Juneau and Glacier Village Super Market Inc., requiring the three parties to bear equally cost of Riverside Drive-Vintage Road the signalization less state and federal funding at such time as the State of Alaska or the City and Borough of Juneau determines such signalization is required.
 - (c) Internal Circulation To provide future access for adjoining property, two access easements shall be provided along the southeastern boundary of the site.

An eight (8) foot wide paved pedestrian/bicycle path shall be constructed along the southern boundary of the site and shall be approved by the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

B. BUILDING

Buildings will be limited to one, two, and three story structures consistent with the style of the established buildings within Vintage Business Park. Preferred building materials will be siding. will stained wood A11 mechanical systems be architecturally concealed. Buildin forty-five (45) feet, provided an Building height shall not exceed additional three feet in height may be allowed in order consistency with existing buildings. to ensure architectural Any exceptions to the height restrictions must be approved by the planning department.

C. LANDSCAPING

- 1. <u>Greenbelt Area</u> Every effort shall be made to preserve existing stands or spruce trees; however, selective pruning along the greenbelt is allowed subject to planning department approval. Landscaping shall be required to create a visual separation from adjoining properties or bike path when a building or parking lot is proposed to be constructed abutting, or in the greenbelt area and shall be subject to approval by the Design Review Board prior to any tree cutting or removal in this area.
- 2. Commercial Area Adjacent to Egan Drive A twenty (20) foot wide landscaped area has been designated along Egan Drive. No tree cutting or removal is allowed without planning department approval.

D. SIGNAGE

Two free-standing main entry signs shall be allowed within the limits of the site. Design Review Standards shall govern on-site signage.

E. LIGHTING

Design Review Standards shall apply.

F. MENDENHALL RIVER GREENBELT

A greenbelt along the entire length of the Mendenhall River where it forms the boundary of the site shall be established. Improvements to the greenbelt area, including the activity centers, shall be reviewed by the department of parks and recreation.

G. SLOPE PROTECTION

The issue of the provision and placement of Class II rip rap at a maximum slope of 1:1 at the northerly five hundred (500) feet of the property along the Mendenhall River and the southerly seventy-five (75) feet as shown on the plan prepared by R & M Consultants entitled "River Bank Protection, FR U.S.S. 1193" dated December 7, 1986, shall be resolved between the applicant, the planning department, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, and the Army Corps of Engineers as soon as possible and with the intention of having the rip rap in place prior to occurrence of erosion problems.

H. MODIFICATIONS TO PLAN

The development of uses on the site shall be as shown on the site plan entitled "Vintage Business Park" by Thomas and Greiner Architects, dated December 9, 1983, as amended by Ordinance Serial No. 86-54am.

Any changes to said site plan, including building design, signage, parking areas, loading areas, internal circulation, landscaping, and lighting, but not including changes in use or building location, must be submitted to and approved by the Design Review Board.

All other amendments must be approved by the Planning Commission, whose decision shall be final unless appealed by staff or the applicant.

Notwithstanding, staff may present any proposed development plan or change in plan to the Planning Commission for approval if deemed necessary by staff.

APPENDIX TO EXHIBIT "A"

ORIGINAL GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL: COMPLETED OR COVERED ELSEWHERE BY EXISTING CODE

- A. TRAFFIC
 - 1. Site Access and Egress
 - (a) A traffic control island shall be constructed at the intersection and shall be approved by the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. A deceleration lane shall be constructed extending from the Riverside Drive acceleration lane on Egan Drive to the proposed intersection and shall be approved by the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.
 - (b) In addition, individual right, left, and through lanes shall be constructed on Vintage Boulevard where it intersects with Riverside Drive subject to CBJ engineering department approval of design.
 - (c) Vintage Boulevard and Bauer Street shall be constructed to city and borough standards with concrete or asphalt curbing on both sides of both streets. A five (5) foot wide concrete or asphalt sidewalk on the westerly side of Vintage Boulevard shall be constructed for its entire length. A

traffic median shall be constructed in the center of Vintage Boulevard to the northerly property line and shall be sodded and planted with occasional trees or shrubs.

An eight (8) foot wide trail shall be constructed along the western and northern portion of the site, adjacent to the Mendenhall River and shall be approved by the parks and recreation department.

(d) Parking shall be as shown on the plan, subject to individual site plan review when buildings are proposed to be permitted by the building department. Parking areas shall be landscaped with a combination of buffers and islands and shall be approved by the Design Review Board prior to construction.

B. BUILDING

With a northwest contemporary architectural style. Building materials will be limited to wood siding with a semi-transparent stain, cedar roofs, and glazed exterior windows. The Vintage Business Park development plan includes a total of four hundred thousand (410,000) square feet of building area. The ten recommended relocation of the greenbelt area may result in the loss of square footage of the building area as proposed. Should this be the case, the loss of building area may be compensated in other structures by the allowance of an exception to the maximum height of thirty-five (35) feet on a square foot for square foot Where buildings abut the greenbelt, an adequate landscape basis. buffer shall be installed to provide a visual separation between the uses and shall be approved by the Design Review Board prior to the issuance of any building permit.

C. LANDSCAPING

- 1. The commercial area located on the southwestern portion of the site shall be landscaped with a double row of spruce along Egan Drive for a minimum of twenty (20) feet in width to minimize the visual impact of the development. Landscaping may be accomplished through a combination of infill or replacement of existing spruce trees. Replacement or infill trees shall be stipulated in subsection 2, "Street Trees," below. The existing stand of spruce, adjacent to Egan Drive, shall be preserved to the greatest extent possible. Prior to any tree cutting or removal in this area, the applicant must receive approval from the Design Review Board.
- 2. <u>Street Trees</u> Street trees shall be planted as shown on the Vintage Business Park site plan dated December

9, 1983. Trees shall alternate with six (6) to twelve (12) foot evergreens interspersed within fifteen (15) to twenty (20) foot deciduous trees.

D. SITE IMPROVEMENTS

Prior to the construction of any buildings, the following site work shall be completed: bank stabilization, fill, drainage, utility sidewalks, and installation. street and The aforementioned site improvements shall be completed no later than one year from the date of the zone change approval. The pedestrian trail along the greenbelt, the installation of benches on the greenbelt, and the pedestrian/bicycle path along Egan Drive shall be completed within one year from the date of the zone change approval.

E. MENDENHALL RIVER GREENBELT

The greenbelt shall vary in width from forty (40) to sixty (60) feet and shall be measured from the spruce line along the river inland subject to planning department approval. In some instances, buildings may be placed closer than forty (40) feet from the spruce line subject to planning department site inspection and approval. As part of the individual review of each building, the planning department shall consider the effect of the location of the building on the greenbelt and the major vegetation in the greenbelt; and if necessary, the planning department may require additional setbacks.
