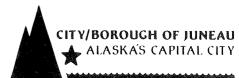

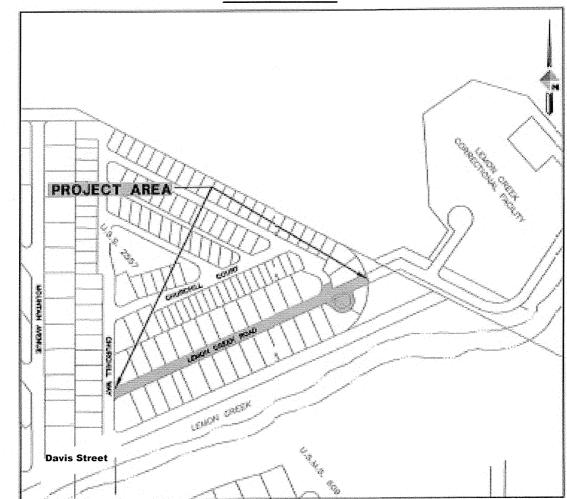

BACKGROUND

Lemon Creek Road lies within the D15 zoning district within the Glacier View Subdivision. The 1,100 foot long street is lined with mobile, single family, duplex and multifamily residences. The primary access to Lemon Creek Road is Churchill Way. The terminus of Lemon Creek Road is the Lemon Creek Correctional Facility (see vicinity map). Lemon Creek Road is serviced by Capital Transit which has a bus stop at the east and west ends of the road. There is a bus turnaround at the northeast end of Lemon Creek Road. The road is also serviced by First Student school busses.

The proposed project is a CBJ Capital Improvement and is listed as Lemon Road Reconstruction in the FY14-19 Six Year Capital Improvement Program with funding in FY14 of \$1,200,000. The road requires full reconstruction because of surface material failure and the lack of a drainage system.

ANALYSIS

According to CBJ 49.10.170(c)

The commission shall review and make recommendations to the assembly on...capital improvement project by any City and Borough agency. The report and recommendation of the commission shall be based upon the provisions of this title, the comprehensive plan, and the capital improvements program.

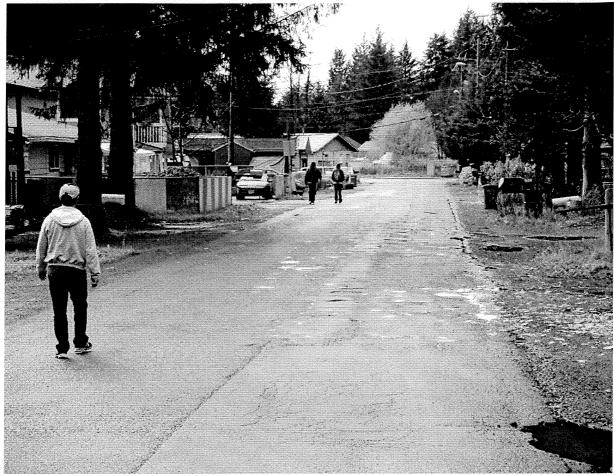


Figure 1: Lemon Creek Road facing west

Lemon Creek Road is a 1,100 foot long public right of way, starting at Churchill Way and extending northeast to the Lemon Creek Correctional Facility (see figure 1). This roadway is classified as a non-arterial, non-collector street. No traffic counts are available for Lemon Creek at the project location. The road also serves Churchill Court, which is a private road (see vicinity map). Lemon Creek Road is serviced by Capital Transit and First Student busses, providing direct access to 27 residences.

The project includes structural replacement of the roadway and asphalt paving, including the bus turnaround at the east end of Lemon Creek Road. Traffic lanes will be 10 feet wide. A sidewalk will be installed on the north side of the street. A pedestrian crossing will connect the sidewalk to the Churchill Way and Davis Street sidewalks. Vehicle traffic primarily enters Lemon Creek Road from the south, making a right-hand turn. A sidewalk on the north side will ensure pedestrians remain clear of turning vehicles. Snow removal from the new sidewalk will be the responsibility of the adjacent homeowners, consistent with CBJ policy for snow removal prioritization. Roadway reconstruction will extend approximately 20 feet onto Churchill Court immediately off of Lemon Creek Road (see figure 2).

The design includes a valley gutter on the south side of the street to improve storm water drainage. A curb gutter will be installed on the sidewalk side. Residences will be able to tie roof drains into the drainage system.

Currently, more than one lot is serviced by the same water line. Where feasible, CBJ will install water lines to each individual lot.

Area residents will experience impacts of noise and traffic delays during project construction. Construction will require the reduction of the street to one lane. Construction will result in a detour onto Churchill Court which is a private road. CBJ Engineering was granted permission by the Churchill Court property owner to detour public traffic onto Churchill Court.

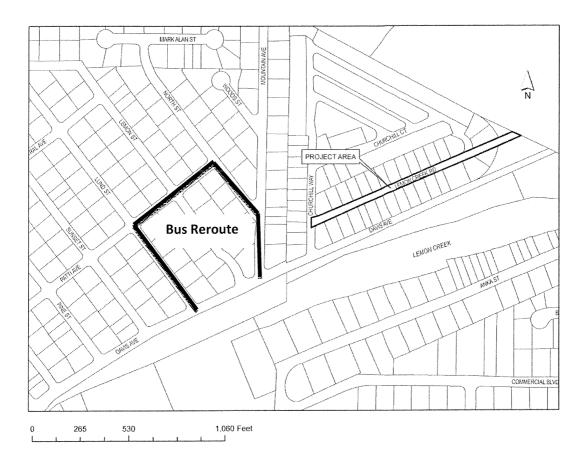


Figure 3: Bus reroute

The project plan is to begin in May near the end of or just after the school year and plans to end before school begins to minimize interference with the school bus schedule. Public Transit and General Engineering worked together on the appropriate rerouting of bus service during the construction period. The public bus will temporarily be rerouted up Mountain Avenue to Patti Avenue to Lund Street with a bus stop on Mountain (see figure 3).

CONFORMITY WITH ADOPTED PLANS

The proposed project was reviewed for conformance with the following CBJ-adopted plans and policies:

Comprehensive Plan (2008) Area-Wide Transportation Plan (2001) Non-Motorized Transportation Plan (2009)

Comprehensive Plan (2008):

There is strong support for the inclusion of sidewalks in the 2008 Comprehensive Plan. As indicated below, the Comprehensive Plan mandates the provision of sidewalks in neighborhood

streets to provide safe pedestrian access to schools, recreational trails and other neighborhood amenities. The project area is one and a half miles from large employers and shopping areas in the Industrial Park as well as Wal-Mart. It is also one and a half miles from Dzantik'i Heeni Middle School.

POLICY 8.1 PROMOTE A BALANCED, WELL-INTEGRATED LOCAL MULTI-MODAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM THAT PROVIDES SAFE, CONVENIENT AND ENERGY-EFFICIENT ACCESS AND TRANSPORT FOR PEOPLE AND COMMODITIES.

With specific consideration to the Lemon Creek neighborhood, the 2008 Comprehensive Plan calls for improvements to transportation facilities.

8.3.IA4 Develop and implement a neighborhood transportation facilities improvement plan, in coordination with an area-wide neighborhood plan, for roadway access, sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, bus pullouts and shelters, intersection control and new intersections for Lemon Creek.

POLICY 8.2 IT IS THE POLICY OF THE CBJ TO PROMOTE AND FACILITATE TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES TO PRIVATE VEHICLES AS A MEANS OF REDUCING TRAFFIC CONGESTION, AIR POLLUTION AND THE CONSUMPTION OF FOSSIL FUELS, AND TO PROVIDE SAFE AND HEALTHY MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO ALL PEOPLE.

8.2.IA3 Implement the pedestrian and non-motorized improvements called for in the Area Wide Transportation Plan as funding becomes available. Where there is a public need for those improvements in the immediate future, actively pursue the funding needed to complete those improvements.

Area-Wide Transportation Plan (AWTP) (2001)

The 'Safety Analysis of Existing System' section of the AWTP identifies a deficient sidewalk system in the Lemon Creek neighborhood. Solutions call for a complete sidewalk system to include Davis Street to the west of Lemon Creek Road. The inclusion of a sidewalk on Lemon Creek Road further adds to the Lemon Creek neighborhood sidewalk system. Improvement Projects includes the following:

Non-Motorized Transportation Plan (NMTP) (2009)

The NMTP highlights deficiencies in the Lemon Creek neighborhood sidewalk system. The plan identifies the Lemon Creek neighborhood as having high numbers of pedestrians and need for more sidewalks. The plan also references Complete Streets Policies as a model for street design standards in Juneau:

"The *Complete Street* movement encourages planning for all users across the transportation network. This does not mean that all streets need to be perfect for all modes, but that the transportation network needs to work for all modes. Rather than requiring a sidewalk on both sides of each street, a *Complete Streets* policy will focus on a pedestrian network that is complete and accessible, allowing pedestrians to reach all destinations safely." (p. 24)

HABITAT

There are no known eagle nests in the area. Lemon Creek Road is in a densely developed residential area where there are no longer wetlands. Lemon Creek, an anadromous stream, runs parallel to Lemon Creek Road approximately 200 feet to the south. CBJ 49.70.310(a)(4) limits construction to within 50 feet of stream banks. Therefore, there are no habitat disturbance concerns with this project.

FINDINGS

The project is consistent with CBJ Land Use Code and applicable plans. The Comprehensive Plan NMTP, and AWTP both call for improved sidewalk connections within neighborhood streets and to neighboring schools, community centers and other neighborhood destinations. Improving the sidewalk network in the area will provide safer, more complete pedestrian network.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt the above analysis and findings, and recommend to the Assembly authorization of the reconstruction of Lemon Creek Road to include installation of a sidewalk with cross section provided and improved drainage.

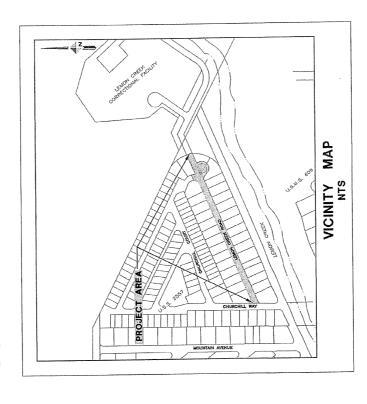
The project consists of reconstruction of Lemon Creek Road which is approximately 1100 feet long. Lemon Creek Road is a residential road within the Glacier View Subdivision and is part of the Capital Transit bus route and the only road access to the Lemon Creek State Prison. The project will include storm drainage improvements, replacement of the roadway structural section, asphalt paving, curb gutter and sidewalk improvements, and may include replacement or repairs of the water and sewer system within the public right of way and other necessary work to successfully complete the project. The reconstruction of the bus turn around at the north end of Lemon Creek Road may also become part of this project.

Due to a high traffic volume it may be necessary to reconstruct Lemon Creek Road in phases. Capital Transit services will have a temporary alternative route during this project.

This project will be put out for bid this fall and will start and be completed during the 2014 construction season.
