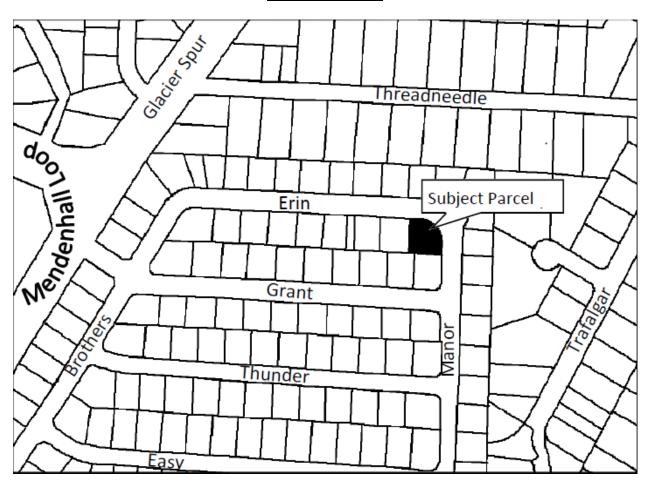

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant would like to build a carport, with the internal width of 12 feet, on the south side of their home located at 4361 Manor Avenue. To do so the applicant is asking for a variance to reduce the side yard setback from 5 feet to 2.5 feet for the carport wall and footing, and a reduction of the required setback for the carport eave from 2 feet to 1.5 feet.

BACKGROUND

The applicant asked for a 2 foot variance for the carport in their application; asking to reduce the side yard setback from 5 feet to 3 feet. As staff reviewed the application and building permit upon submittal, staff noticed that the applicant had measured the internal width of the carport. Setbacks are measured from the external material of the building to the property line. Staff contacted the applicant and discussed that the variance description being asked for in the applicants building plans was different from the description in the narrative. With permission from the applicant staff changed the variance description to a variance of 2.5 feet (two and a half feet) for the carport. Staff and the applicant also discussed the need for a variance to the eave setback for the proposed carport eave.

ANALYSIS

The subject parcel is located in a D-5 zoning district. The setbacks in the D-5 zone are as follows: 20 feet for the front and rear yards; 13 feet for the street side yard setback; and 5 feet for the side yard setback. The applicant is asking to reduce their side yard setback to 2.5 feet for a carport.

Architectural features of buildings are allowed to project into required yard setbacks, per the City and Borough of Juneau's Land Use Code Title 49. 25.430(4)(A):

(4)Projections into required yards.

(A) Architectural features. Architectural features and roof eaves may project into a required yard four inches for each foot of yard setback required but no closer than two feet to the side and rear lot lines.

Though eaves are allowed to project into required yard setbacks, per the above citation, the eave shall be no closer than two feet to a side property line.

Variance Requirements

Under CBJ §49.20.250 where hardship and practical difficulties result from an extraordinary situation or unique physical feature affecting only a specific parcel of property or structures lawfully existing thereon and render it difficult to carry out the provisions of Title 49, the Board of Adjustment may grant a Variance in harmony with the general purpose and intent of Title 49. A Variance may vary any requirement or regulation of Title 49 concerning dimensional and other design standards, but not those concerning the use of land or structures, housing density, lot coverage, or those establishing construction standards. A Variance may be granted after the prescribed hearing and after the Board of Adjustment has determined:

1. That the relaxation applied for or a lesser relaxation specified by the Board of Adjustment would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners.

The applicant could build a carport and meet the side yard setback, but by granting the requested variance relief would be given to the owner of the property in that he would be able to build a carport big enough to store his boat and or utility trailer.

The relaxation applied for would be consistent with other properties in the neighborhood that have carports that appear to be within side yard setbacks (see Attachment C).

Yes. The criterion is met.

2. That relief can be granted in such a fashion that the intent of this title will be observed and the public safety and welfare be preserved.

The intent of Title 49 is established in Section 49.05.100 Purpose and Intent. Those sections, which are applicable to the requested variance, are as follows:

- 1) To achieve the goals and objectives and implement the policies of the Juneau Comprehensive Plan and the coastal management program;
- 2) To ensure that future growth and development in the city and borough is in accord with the values of its residents;
- 3) To identify and secure, for present and future residences, the beneficial impacts of growth while minimizing the negative impacts;
- 4) To ensure that future growth is of the appropriate type, design, and location, and is served by a proper range of public services and facilities such as water, sewage, and electrical distribution systems, transportation, schools, parks and other public requirements, and in general to promote public health, safety and general welfare;
- 5) To provide adequate open space for light and air; and
- 6) To recognize the economic value of land and encourage its proper and beneficial use.

There is no evidence to suggest that the construction of a carport would impact public safety and welfare.

Yes. The criterion is met.

3. That the authorization of the Variance will not injure nearby property.

City and Borough of Juneau, General Engineering Staff, have concerns with drainage for the proposed carport (see Attachment E). The concern is that the carport roof is proposed to slant towards the side property line. General Engineering Staff has stated that drainage would have to be addressed prior to construction of the proposed carport, either through a gutter and down spout system or through grading of the ground to avoid stormwater runoff onto the neighboring property. Stormwater and drainage will be addressed through a Grading and Drainage Permit through the Community Development Department as a condition of approval for the proposed carport.

Yes. This criterion can be met by addressing grading and drainage around the proposed carport.

4. That the Variance does not authorize uses not allowed in the district involved.

The primary use of the property is a single-family home. The variance would allow for a carport for the owner to park their boat and or trailer; the carport is considered accessory to the residential use.

Yes. The criterion is met.

- 5. That compliance with the existing standards would:
 - (A) Unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permissible principal use;

The variance is for the construction of the carport which is an accessory use for a permissible use.

No. The criterion is not met.

(B) Unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property in a manner which is consistent as to scale, amenities, appearance or features, with existing development in the neighborhood of the subject property;

The proposed carport is consistent in the scale, amenities, appearance and features of existing development in the neighborhood.

Yes. This criterion is met.

(C) Be unnecessarily burdensome because unique physical features of the property render compliance with the standards unreasonably expensive;

The proposed project is not unique to the neighborhood. If the variance was not granted the property owner could construct a smaller carport and meet the required setback.

No. The criterion is not met.

or

(D) Because of preexisting nonconforming conditions on the subject parcel the grant of the Variance would not result in a net decrease in overall compliance with the

Land Use Code, CBJ Title 49, or the building code, CBJ Title 19, or both.

The granting of the variance would result in a net decrease in the overall compliance with the Land Use Code, as the granting of the reduced side yard setback, and would extend 2.5 feet beyond the required setback.

No. The criterion is not met.

Since sub criteria 5B is met, criterion 5 is met.

6. That a grant of the Variance would result in more benefits than detriments to the neighborhood.

No detriments have been identified to the neighborhood if the variance was granted.

Yes. The criterion is met.

FINDINGS

1. Is the application for the requested Variance complete?

Yes. Staff finds the application contains the information necessary to conduct full review of the proposed operations. The application submittal by the applicant, including the appropriate fees, substantially conforms to the requirements of CBJ Chapter 49.15.

Per CBJ §49.70.900 (b)(3), General Provisions, the Director makes the following Juneau Coastal Management Program consistency determination:

2. Will the proposed development comply with the Juneau Coastal Management Programs?

Not Applicable.

3. Does the variance as requested, meet the criteria of Section 49.20.250, Grounds for Variances?

Yes. Based on the evaluation above, the variance, as requested, meets the criteria of Section 49.25.250, Grounds of Variances.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board of Adjustment adopt the Director's analysis and findings and **APPROVE** the requested Variance, VAR2014 0006. The Variance permit would allow for a reduction to the side yard setback from 5 feet to 2.5 feet to allow a carport, and a reduction of the required setback for an eave for the carport from 2 feet to 1.5 feet.

With the following condition:

1. Prior to construction the applicant shall address site grading and drainage through a Grading and Drainage Permit; or add a gutter and down spout system to the carport roof that complies with the roof eave setback of 1.5 feet.

 - (D) Because of preexisting nonconforming conditions on the subject parcel, the grant of the variance would not result in a net decrease in overall compliance with the land use code, title 49, or the building code, title 19, or both; and
- (6) A grant of the variance would result in more benefits than detriments to the neighborhood.

- 3. Gutter to drain into ditch.

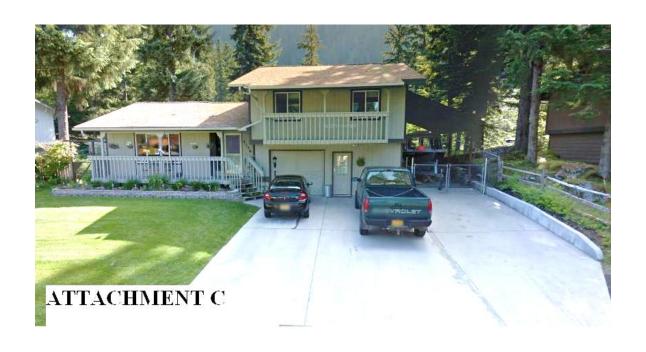
Attachment to existing house
