The Board of Adjustment, at its regular public meeting, adopted the analysis and findings listed in the attached memorandum dated April 8, 2014, and amended the findings (see below) to approve the Variance to be conducted as described in the project description and project drawings submitted with the application and with the following condition:

- 1. The four foot ingress/egress access easement shall be developed with a stairway or boardwalk from the southern property line to the northern property line.
- 2. Any portion of the deck or stairs within 3 feet of the eastern property line shall not exceed 30 inches in height in accordance with CBJ 49.25.430(4)(C)(i).

New Findings made by Board of Adjustment during hearing

- 1. Approving the reduction of the side yard setback to zero feet for a deck will provide for safer access along the eastern four foot wide ingress/egress easement. Conditioning the height of the deck and associated stairs, to 30 inches or less within 3 feet of the eastern property line will protect the privacy of adjacent neighbors. This will be more consistent with justice to other property owners.
- 2. A developed eastern ingress/egress easement with the condition that the four foot access easement be developed with a stairway or boardwalk from the southern property line to the northern property line and limited to 30 inches in height within 3 feet of the eastern property line observes the intent of Title 49 and preserves public safety and welfare.

Does the variance as requested, meet the criteria of Section 49.20.250, Grounds for Variances?

Yes. All criterions are met, therefore, the variance meets Section CBJ § 49.20.250.
