Application For: A Variance to reduce the rear yard setback from 20 feet to zero feet for the

placement of six containers for use as a commercial hydroponic vegetable

farm.

The Board of Adjustment, at its regular public hearing, adopted the analysis and findings listed in the attached memorandum dated November 13, 2014, and amended the findings (see below) to approve the Variance to be conducted as described in the project description and project drawings submitted with the application and with the following condition:

 Prior to a Certificate of Occupancy an As-built stamped by a licensed surveyor shall be provided to the Community Development Department.

New findings made by Board of Adjustment during hearing

1. That the relaxation applied for or a lesser relaxation specified by the Board of Adjustment would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners.

Approving the reduction of the rear yard setback to <u>five</u> feet for the placement of six container vans will provide substantial relief to the owner of the property in that the vans will be more accessible stacked three across and two high. The lesser relaxation of a five foot rear yard setback will allow all six containers to be in the rear yard and stacked two high minimizing the visual impact to the neighborhood. This configuration of the containers will be more consistent with justice to other property owners

2. That relief can be granted in such a fashion that the intent of this title will be observed and the public safety and welfare be preserved.

Public safety and welfare will be preserved with a five foot rear yard setback because the rear lot line is adjacent to a vacant lot with no developed access. The placement of the containers five feet from the rear lot line preserves light and air by minimizing the impact to the neighboring properties.

3. That the authorization of the Variance will not injure nearby property.

A five foot rear yard setback avoids the need to stack containers 3 high or put them in the side yard. The configuration with the five foot setback in the rear is the least harmful to nearby property.

- 5. That compliance with the existing standards would:
 - (B) Unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property in a manner which is consistent as to scale, amenities, appearance or features, with existing development in the neighborhood of the subject property;

The subject property is within 500 feet of light commercial uses. There are containers at the nearby gas station. Therefore, the development is consistent as to scale, amenities, appearance and features with existing development in the neighborhood.

6. That a grant of the Variance would result in more benefits than detriments to the neighborhood.

The entire community will benefit from the reduction of the rear yard setback to five feet. The Variance will allow for the proposed hydroponic vegetable farm to produce vegetables to be sold in locally.

Does the variance as requested, meet the criteria of Section 49.20.250, Grounds for Variances?

Yes. All criterions are met, therefore, the variance meets Section CBJ § 49.20.250.

Effective Date: The permit is effective upon approval by the Board, December 9, 2014

Expiration Date: The permit will expire 18 months after the effective date, or June 9, 2016 if no

Building Permit has been issued and substantial construction progress has not been made in accordance with the plans for which the development permit was authorized. Application for permit extension must be submitted thirty days prior to the expiration

date.
